


Edward Bell FSA, older son of publisher George Bell

 included Potter's Hampstead Wells! (Firm called Bell & Hyman still extant 1984)
 He married Alice, daughter of Rev JW van Rees Hoets of Cape Colony
 In 1890, he moved his family from Hampstead Hill Gardens
 to 6, The Mount.

George Bell lived at 28 Belize Park Gardens 1849-60, Westcroyd 1860-82 (when Eton Estate redeveloped the area), and Bramerton 1882-90. Buried in Highgate Cemetery. First employer and patron of Helen Allingham née Paterson.
