

Emma Brooks: "A literary person who visited Wyldes" -
see II 942.17: Wilson, Wyldes and its story

Stopford Augustus Brooks, 1832 - 1916 - see DRB
A Divine and man of letters; BA Trinity College, Dublin.
Ordained 1857.
Minister of Proprietary Chapel of St. James, York St., London
1866 - 76, and of Bedford Chapel, Bloomsbury 1876 - 95.
A celebrated preacher, he seceded from Anglican Church 1880.
Works include Life and Letters of Frederick W. Robertson
(1865) and Primer of English Literature (1876)

Family lived at 92 Gloucester Terrace

Emma, née Beaumont, married Stopford in 1858.

Graham and Evelyn were presumably their children.

Leonard was the elder son of the artist, Leslie Brooks (see O 77),
and brother of Henry Brooks, Hampstead MP.

Stopford often preached at Rosalyn Hill Chapel, e.g. after its
enlargement in 1886.

Thomas William Rolleston at Ardeevin, Christchurch Hill in 1910 Directory,
and 16 Prince Arthur Road in 1921 - presumably his wife only!
