"So long as the writing was good it welcomed radical departures from established Edwardian ways of them in regard to politics, literature, art, or anything else, and in consequence it had the reputation among young writers of being the paper to get into ... Shaw, Wells, Bennett, Chesterton, Belloc wrote for no payment ... Front page designed by Eric Gill ..."

Born Dickie Horrage (when Shaw wanted to annoy him, he called him Orrage), helped by local Fenstanton squire to go to teachers' college, school teacher in Leeds, Joined Theosophical Society.

- 325 Met Katherine Mansfield 1910. Letter KM to ARO 9.2.1921: "You taught me to write, you taught me to think; you showed me what there was to be done and what not to do." Introduced KM to Gurdjieff, whose Institute for the Harmonious Development of Man KM and ARO joined in 1922 at Fontainebleau.
- "Man is composed of innumerable I's, many of which said contradictory things. Then he drew a circle on the blackboard and divided it by crisscross lines until it looked like a fly's eye seen under the microscope. In each little space he put an I, and then he said, 'This is a picture of man'." (lecture by disciple of Gurdjieff).
