Architect and author, born
17-9-42 - died at his home in
Brentwood on 5-4-51 aged 32.

His buildings include the John Rylands Memorial Library in Manchester, the new buildings of Oxford College in Regents Park, 2 local churches, St. Luke's in Kidderpore Avenue and St. Luke's in Kentish Town, and in 1981 he built ~~W.H.T.~~ One, the old name for the Manor Farm of Hemel Hempstead in Frogstal Lane. He was awarded the Royal Gold Medal for Architecture in 1912 by the R.I.B.A., and was a friend of Coventry Patmore - in 1875 he produced a book about dye and the Romney Marshes titled 'A Visit to Coombes' in 1880. In 1876 he married Mary Theresa Gill Brownell, second daughter of Charles Brownell, C. 3rd Baronet of Tillicroft Brownell, 4th Viscount Borthwick, Esq., who died at her own home,
