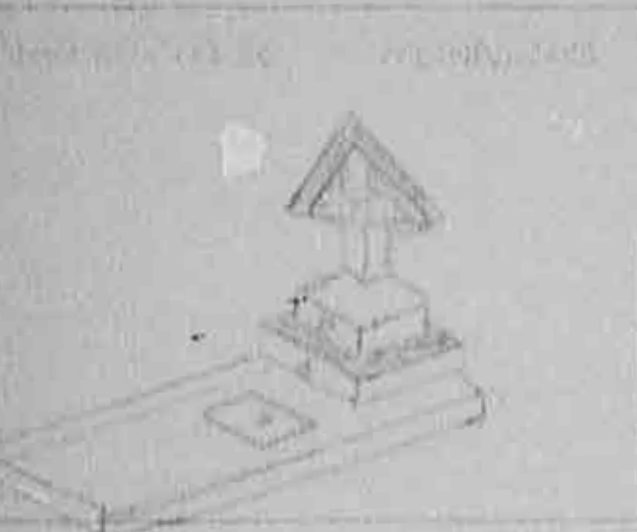

 who was the 1st of the
 'Streets of Hampstead'

Architect and author, born
 17.9.42 - died at his home in
 Hampstead on 5.4.39 aged 92.

His buildings include the John
 Rylands Memorial Library in Manchester
 the new buildings of Bedford College
 in Regents Park, 2 local churches,
 St. Luke's in Kidderpore Avenue and
 St. Luke's in Kenton Town, and in
 1881 he built ^{for himself} Hill Oak, the old house
 for the Manor Park of Hampstead in
 Trognal Lane. He was awarded the
 Royal Gold Medal for architecture in
 1912 by the R.I.B.A. and was a friend
 of Coventry Patmore - In 1875 he
 produced a book about Aye and the
 Romney Marshes titled 'A quiet Corner
 of the land'. In 1876 he married
 Miss Theresa Alice Drummond, second
 daughter of Maurice Drummond, C.B.,
 5th descendant of William Drummond,
 4th Viscount Strathallan, (C.B.).
