

Who's Who 1965: Son of Rt. Rev. E.A. Knox, Bishop of Lahore

Letter from Mary E. Knox (His second wife), 7a Frognal Mansions, 97 Frognal,
dated 20.6.84, and conversation beside the grave during the survey:

The quotation on the MS is from W.J. Cory's [Heraclitus]:

Still are thy pleasant voices, thy nightingales, awake;
(For Death, he taketh all away, but them he cannot take.)

There is a tablet to EVOG in St Paul's, close to Walter de la Mare's. It was
sculpted by John Skelton, of Hassocks, Sussex, who claimed descent from the
poet of that name.

The Northumberland slate headstone was made by Messrs. Gorden Graftsmen, Ltd,
5 Cline Road, N11 2LX. They kept very faithfully to instructions with regard
to Roman lettering and script.

Heraclitus was a favourite of my husband's all his life, and the lines
well-chosen (by his daughter) for a memorial to a singer of words.
