




C A P. CXLVI.

An Act for the better regulating and preferving Parish and other Registers of Births, Baptisins, Marriages, and Burials, in England.

[28th July 1812.]

HEREAS the amending the Manner and Form of keeping and of preferving Registers of Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials of His Majetly's Subjects in the feveral Parishes and Plaza in England, will greatly facilitate the Proof of Pedigrees of Perfons claiming to be entitled to Real or Perfonal Effates, and be otherwise of great public Benefit and Advantage; be it therefore enacted by the King's most Excellent Miselytly, by and with the Advice and Confent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this prefent Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same. That from and after the Thirty-fird Day of December One thousand eight hundred and twelve, Registers of Public and Private Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials, folemnized according to the Rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, within all Parishes or Chapelries in England, whether subject to the Ordinary, or Peculiar, or other Jurisdiction, shall be made and keep by the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister of every Parish (or of any Chapelry where the Ceremonies of Baptisin, Marriage, and Burial have been usually, and ultrable Taper, to be provided by His Majestly's Printer as Occasion may require, at the Expence of the respective Parishes or Chapelries; whereon shall be printed, upon each Side of every Leaf, the Heads of Information herein required to be entered in the Registers of Baptisins, Marriages, and Burials respectively, and every such Entry shall be numbered progressively from the Beginning to the End of each Book, the First Entry to be distinguished by Number One; and every such Entry shall be numbered with progressively from the Entry next following by a printed Line, according to the Forms contained in the Schedules (A.) (B.) (C.) hereto amexed; and every Page of every such Book shall be numbered with progressive Numbers, the First Page being marked with the Number 1. in the Middle of the upper Part of such Page, and every subsequent Page being marked in like Manner with progressive Numbers, from Number 1. to the End

II. And, for better enfuring the Regularity and Uniformity of fach Regifter Books, be it further enacted. That a printed Copy of this Act, together with one Book to prepared as aforefaid, and adapted to the Form of the Regifter of Baptifins preferibed in the Schedule (A.) to this Act annexed; and alfo one other Book fo prepared as aforefaid, and adapted to the Form preferibed for the Regifter of Marriages in the Schedule (B.) to this Act annexed; and alfo one other Book fo prepared as aforefaid, and adapted to the Form preferibed for the Regifter of Burials in the Schedule (C.) to this Act annexed, thall, as foon as conveniently may be after the patting of this Act, be provided and transmitted by His Majedly's Printer to the Officiating Ministers of the feveral Parifhes and Chapelries in England respectively, who are hereby required to use and apply the fame in and to the Purposes of this Act; and such Books respectively full be proportioned to the Population of the several Parishes and Chapelries, according to the last Returns of such Population made under the Authority of Parisment; and other Books of like Form and Quality fhall for the like Purposes be furnished from Time to Time by the Churchwardens or Chapelwardens of every Parish or Chapely, at the Expence of the faid Parish or Chapely, whenever they shall be required by the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister to provide the fame; and all such Books shall be of Paper, unless required to be of Parchment by such Churchwardens or Chapelwardens respectively.

III. And be it further enacted, That fuch Registers shall be kept in such separate Books aforesaid, and that every such Rector, Vicar, Curate, or officiating Minister shall as soon as possible after the

Certificate of Bap-tifin or Burial when performed in any other Place than the Parifi Church or Church Yard, to be according to Sche-dule (D.); and the Entry of fuch Bap-tifin or Burial in the Parifi Regilter to be diftinguished ac-cordingly.

IV. And be it further enacted, That whenever the Ceremony of Baptim or Burial shall be performed in any other Place than the Parish Church or Church Yard of any Parish (or the Chapel or Chapel Yard of any Chapelry providing its own distinct Registers) and such Ceremony shall be performed by any shifter on the being the Rector, Vicar, Minister, or Curate of such Parish or Chapelry, the Minister who shall perform such Ceremony of Baptism or Burial shall, on the same or on the next Day, transmit to the Rector, Vicar, or other Minister of such Parish or Chapelry, or his Curate, a Certificate of such Baptism or Burial in the Form contained in the Schedule (D.) to this Act annexed, and the Rector, Vicar, Minister, or Curate of such Parish or Chapelry, shall thereupon enter such Baptism or Burial according to such Certificate in the Book kept pursuant to this Act for such Purpose; and shall add to such Entry the following Words, "According to the Certificate of the Reverend" transfinisted to me on the

V. And be it further enacted, That the feveral Books wherein fuch Entries shall respectively be made, and all Register Books heretofore in use, shall be deemed to belong to every such Parish or Chapelry respectively, and shall be kept by, and remain in the Power and Custody of the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or other Officiating Minister of each respective Parish or Chapelry as aforesaid, and shall be by him fasfely and securely kept in a dry well-painted Iron Chest, to be provided and repaired as Oceasion may require, at the Expence of the Parish or Chapelry, and which faid Chest containing the said Books shall be confinently kept locked in some dry, sligh, and fecure Place within the usual Place of Residence of such Restor, Vicar, Curate, or other Officiating Minister (if resident within the Parish or Chapelry) or in the Parish Church or Chapelry and the subsequence of such Restor, Vicar, Curate, or other Officiating Minister (if resident within the Parish or Chapelry or in the Parish Church or Chapelry and the State of the State of the State of the Purpose of making such Entries therein as aforesaid, or for the Inspection of Persons destrous to make fearch therein, or to obtain Copies from or out of the faine, or to be proceed as Evidence in some Court of Law or Equity, or to be inspected as to the State and Condition thereof, or for some of the Purpose of this Act; and that immediately after making such respective Entries, or producing the said Books respectively for the Purpose aforesaid, the said Books shall forthwith again be safely and securely deposited in the Said Chest.

VI. And be it further caacted, That at the Expiration of Two Months after the Thirty-first Day of December One thousand eight hundred and thirteen, and at the Expiration of Two Months after the End of every fublequent Year, fair Copies of all the Entries of the several Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials, which shall have been folemulated or shall have taken place within the Year perceding, shall be made by the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or other resident or Officiating Minister, for by the Churchwardens, Chapel-wardens, Cleke, or other Perfon duly appointed for the Purpose under and by the Direction of such Rector, Vicar, Curate, or other resident or Officiating Minister,) on Parchment, in the same Form as prescribed in the Schedules hereunto annexed (to be provided by the respective Parishes); and the Contents of such Copies shall be verified and figned in the Form following, by the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister of the Parish or Chapelry to which such respective Register Book shall appertain: appertain:

VII. And be it further enacted, That Copies of the faid Regifter Books, verified and attefted as aforefaid, fhall, whether fuch Parifh or Chapelry fhall be fubject to the Ordinary, Peculiar, or other Juristifiction, be transfinited by fuch Churchwardens or Chapelwardens, after they, or One of them, shall have figned the fame, by the Poft, to the Registrars of each Diocefe in England within which the Church or Chapel shall be fituated, on or before the First Day of June One thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and on or before the First Day of June in every subsequent Year.

VIII. And be it further enacted, That the Registrar of every Diocese in England shall, with And be it further enacted, That the Regittrar of every Diocete in England hall, on or before the Firth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and fourteen, and on or before the Firth Day of July in every fublequent Year, make a Report to the Bifthop of fuch Diocete, whether the Copies of the Regillers of the Baptifus, Marriages, and Burials, in the feveral Parifhes and Places within fuch Diocete, have been fent to fuch Regillers, in the Manner and within the Time herein required; and in the Event of any Fallure of the Transmittion of the Copies of the Regillers as herein required, by the Churchwardens and Chapelwardens of any Parifi or Chapelry in England, the Regillrar shall state the Default of the Parish or Chapelry specially in his Report to the Bishop.

IX. And be it further enacted, That in case the Rector, Vicar, or other Officiating Minister or Curate And be it further enacted, That in cate the Rector, Vicar, or other Officiating Minister or Curate of any Parish or Chapeley findin leggled or redige to verify and fign such Copies of such several Register Books, and such Declaration as aforesaid, so that the Churchwardens or Chapelwardens shall not be able to transmit the same, as required by this Act, such Churchwardens or Chapelwardens shall, within the Time required by this Act for the Transmission thereof, certify such Desult to the Registrar of the Diocese within which such Parish or Chapelry shall be, who shall specially state the same in his Report to the Bishep of such Diocese.

X. And, for the obtaining of Returns and Regifters of Baptifins and Burials in Extra-parochial Places in England, where there is no Church or Chapel, be it further enacted, That in all Cafes of the Baptifin of any Child, or the Burial of any Perfon in any Extra-parochial Place in England, according to the Rice of the Elabilified Church, where there is no Church or Chapel, it full be lawful for the officiating Minister within One Month after fuch Baptifin or Burial, to deliver to the Rector, Vicar, or Curate of fuch Parlis immediately adjoining to the Place in which fuch Baptifin or Burial hall take place, as the Ordinary final direct, a Memorandum of fuch Baptifin or Burial, figned by the Perfon employed about the finne, together with Two of the Perfon attending the fame, according as the Nature of the Cafe may respectively require; and every such Memorandum respectively final contain all such Particulars as are herein-before required; and every such Memorandum delivered to the Rector, Vicar, or Curate of any such adjoining Parlis or Chapelry, shall be entered in the Register of his Parlis, and form a Part thereof.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the Superfcription upon all Letters and Packets containing the Le Copies of fuch Parith or other Regillers, to be transfuitted by the Polt to the feveral Offices of the Chick Regillers as a forefaid, fluid be indorfed and figned by the Churchwardens or Chapelwardens of Every refpective Parith and Chapelry in England, in the Form contained in Schedule (E.); and that all furth Letters and Packets shall be carried and conveyed by Means of His Majely's Polt Office to, and be delivered at the Offices of the faid Regillrars, without Poltage or other Charge being paid or payable for the fame.

XII. And be it further enacted, That when and fo often as the Copies of the faid Register Rocks of Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials as aforefaid, and also the faid Litts of Births, Baptisms, Itarriages, or Burials as aforefaid, final be transmitted to the Office of the faid Registerars respectively as facefaids, precious herein-before contained for that Purpose, the faid Registerars as facefaids, principant to the Directions herein-before contained for that Purpose, the faid Registers to be fairly some contained by the fairly some c XII. And be it further enacted, That when and fo often as the Copies of the faid Regifter Books of Baptifins, Marriages, and Burish as aforefaid, and afto the faid Lills of Births, Baptifins, Marriages, or Burish as aforefaid, burium to the Directions herein-before contained for that Purpoie, the faid Regifters falls respectively cause all the faid Books and Lilts to be fastly and fecurely deposited, kept, and preferved from Damage or Deftruction by Fire or otherwife, and to be carefully arranged for the Purpoie of being reforted to as Occasion may require; and the faid Regifters respectively fall alio cause correct alphabetical Lifts to be made and kept in Books fuitable to the Purpoie, of the Names of all Perfons and Places menvioned in such Books and Lists as shall have been transmitted to the faid Registrars respectively, which alphabetical Lists and Books, and also the Copies of Registers and Lists for transmitted to the said Registrars as aforefaid, shall be open to public Search at all reasonable Times on Payment of the suful Fees. on Payment of the ufual Fees.

XIII. And whereas in many Diocefes the Places wherein the Copies of the Parochial Registers of Report to be Baptisms, Marriages, and Burials, as well as the original Wills proved within the same respectively, are kept, at March 2

kept, are infufficient for their being preferved with due Care; for which a Remedy should be applied in those Dioceses where it shall be sound necessary; be it further enacted, That in order to a due Examination thereof, the Bishop, together with the Custodes Rotulorum of the several Counties within each Diocese, and the Chancellor thereof, shall before the First Day of February One thousand eight hundred and thirteen, cause a careful Survey to be made of the several Places in which the Parochial Registers, and the Wills proved within the Diocese, are kept; and shall make a Report to His Majestly's Most Honourable Privy Council, of the State of the same, on or before the First Day of March following, setting forth in each Case whether the Buildings are in all Respects fit and proper for the Prefervation of Papers of the above Defeription, as well with respect to Space as to Security from Fire, and to Prottedion from Damp, and if not, at what probable Expence they can be made so; and where the Instruments and Papers before mentioned are kept in Dwellinghouse or other Places, which cannot be made fit and secure for the due Prefervation thereof, then and in such Case the Persons before named shall eviquire and report in sike Manner at what Expence proper Buildings may be provided, and in what Places, so so to have one Place within each Diocese for the due Prefervation of all such Registers and Wills; together with their Opinion upon the most suitable Mode of remunerating the Officers employed in each Registry, for their additional Trouble and Expence in carrying the Provisions of this Act into Execution.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That if any Perfon shall knowingly and wilfully infert, or cause, or permit to be inferted in any such Register Book of such Baptisns, Burials, or Marriages as aforeshid, or in any such Copy of any such Register for directed to be transsmitted to the Registrars as aforeshid, or in any such List or Declarations also directed to be transsmitted to such Registrars as aforeshid, or in any such List or Declarations also directed to be transsmitted to such Registrars as aforeshid, or for any such the property of the such presearch of the such property of the such property of the such pro

XV. Provided always, and be it enacted, That no Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister of any Parish or Chapel, who shall discover any Error to have been committed in the Form or Substance of the Entry in the Register Book of any such Baptism, Burial, or Marriage, respectively by him folenmized, shall be Isable to all or any of the Penalties herein mentioned, if he shall within One Calendar Month after the Discovery of such Error, in the Presence of the Parent or Parents of the Child whose Baptism may have been entered in such Register, or of the Parties married, or in the Presence of Two Persons who shall have attended at any Burial, or in case of the Death or Absence of the respectively attest the same), after and correct the Entry which shall have been sound erroneous, according to the Truth of the Case, by Entry in the Margin of the Book wherein such erroneous Entry shall have been made, without any Alteration or Obliteration of the original Entry, and shall sign such Entry in the Margin, and add to such Signature the Day of the Month and Year when such Correction shall be made:

Provided also, that in the fair Copy of the Registers respectively which finall be translatived to the Registers of the Discoes, the said Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister shall certify the Alterations fo made by him as aforefaid.

XVI. Provided always, That nothing in this Act contained fhall in any Manner diminify or increase the Fees heretofore payable or of Right due to any Minister for the Performance of any of the beforementioned Duties, or to any Minister or Registrar, for giving Copies of such Registrations, but that all due legal and accustomed Fees on fuch Occasions, and all Powers and Remedies for Recovery thereof, shall be and remain as though this Act had not been made.

XVII. Provided alfo, and be it enacted, That no Duplicate or Copy of any Register of Baptism Marriage, or Burial, made under the Directions and for the Purposes of this Act, shall be chargeable with any Stamp Duty thereon; any Act now in force to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding

XVIII. And be it further enacted, That One Half of the Amount of all Fines or Penalties to be levied in purfuance of this Act, shall go to the Perion who shall inform or sue for the same; and the Remainder of such Fines as shall be imposed on any Churchwarden or Chapelwarden shall go to the Poor of the

And be it further enacted, That the Rector, Vicar, Curate, or Officiating Minister of every Parish and Chapelry in England, whether subject to the Ordinary, Peculiar, or other Jurissiction, shall transmit to the Registrar of the Dioces in which the Parish or Chapelry shall be struated, before the First Day of Jane One thousand eight hundred and thirteen, a List of all Registers which now are in such Parish or Chapelry respectively, stating the Periods at which they respectively commence and terminate, the Periods (if any) for which they are deficient, and the Places where they are deposited.

XX. And be it further enaced, That all and every the Provisions in this Act shall extend, so far as Circumstances will permit, to Cathedral and Collegiate Churches, and Chapels of Colleges or Hospitals, and the burying Grounds belonging thereto; and to the Ministers who shall officiate in such Cathedral or Collegiate Churches, and Chapels of Colleges or Hospitals and burying Grounds respectively, and shall baptize, marry, or bury any Person or Persons, although such Cathedral or Collegiate Churches, or Chapels of Colleges or Hospitals, or the bunistics Officiating therein may not be, as such, parceinal Ministers, and there shall be no Churchwarden or Churchwardens thereof; and in all such Cades, the Books herein-before directed to be provided, shall be provided, shall be provided, shall be provided, shall be provided at the Expence of the Body having Right to appoint the Officiating Minister in every such Cathedral or Collegiate Church or Chapel of a College or Hospital; and Copies thereof shall be transmitted to the Registrar of the Discorde within which such Cathedral or Collegiate Church or Chapel of a College or Hospital fall be, by the Officiating Minister of such Church, in like thereof fiall be transmitted to the Registrar of the Discrete within which fuch Cathedral or Collegiate Church or Chappel of a Collegia or Hospital shall be, by the Olificating Minister of such Church, in like Manner as is herein directed with respect to parochial Ministers, and shall be attested by Two of the Olificers of such Church, College, or Hospital, as the Copies of parochial Registers are herein directed to be attested by Churchwardens: Provided always, that nothing in this Act contained shall extend to repeal any Provision contained in an Act passed in the Twenty-fixth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, initiated An AB for better preventing Clandesline Marriages.
