Matthew Cooper of the Parish of St. James Westminster in the County of Middlesex, widower, and Ann Wilcox of the Town of Stafford, Spinster, were married on the 16th day of August, 1738; with Licence from His Grace of Canterbury. By Mr. Wright.

Robert Cox of Hampstead in the County of Middlesex, Bachelor, and Dye Foreman of St. Martin in the Fields in the said County, Spinster, were married November 5th, 1738; with Licence from His Grace of Canterbury. By Mr. Wright.

B.
