An Account of Hamptead - 25 January 1744/5
This was extracted from Accou'ts Registerium of the Locc

He writes in the following Manner and Verbatim

He calls it Hamptead Chapel Curacy

This Parish of Hamptead (south Weston) standeth under a Hill
in a very healthfull air having London in a very pleasant
prospect from which it is distant between 4 & 5 Miles to the
North West and is situated in the Liberty of Greenwich and
Woolwich borowne

Vide Mon. Ang. King Ethelred. Father to King Edward the Confessor gave
Vol 1. 322 Hamptead to the Church of Westminster Which the said King
Edward confirmed to it by his Charter dated 8 Kal. Jani
1066.

As to the Church here which is Dedicated to --
It was of old a Chapel annexed to the Church of
Weston. The Rectors whereof were for sometime Instituted to it
cum Capella de Hamptead annexa and after this manner
it continued from the year 1661 till about the year 1478
about which time the Abbot of Westm' 1661, who
was Prior of the Chapter of Westm' became Bishop
thereof and from thenceforth this Chapel of Hamptead was no
longer Revert or reposed as a Chapel annexed to the Church of
Westm' but became (what it is) a Donative or Curacy

in the gift of the Abbot of Westm' until this
Suppression by K. Henry 8. Who in the 32 Year of his Reign
VIII page 7 granted this Chapel or Church and the Patronage of the same
now made Bishop of Westm'. But that Bishop being deposed
by K. Edward VI. 148 in the 4th year of his reign. Comes

the Bishop of London saving as to Hills of Administration which

It pays no Ferte Tracts, Tenthys, Occurrences, nor Synodals.

But from the year 1619 (without being tedious to name all
the Intermissions) to this time they have all been duly
Landed into the said Living, Patronage or Imperial Curacy
and it which you please the most certaine of a Patronage its
Administrator with Curacy by the Bishop of London for the same being
been all (as appears by the Registry belonging to the said Bishop)
constantly used and as constantly attended Sir Thos Deacon
of Midw' Visitation &c. The People of Parishes as

at the S. P. B. of Archdeacon Visitation. Annually or Triennially
& often ake under their authority since the year above specified and
before for what appears to the contrary &c.

Now therefore as this has almost ~~all~~ the signatures of a Parish &c a Parish Church I has acted justly to that denomination. And if a Parish Church can't be built down of a New Church Built in one place that is not exempt from the Bp or Admirals Jurisdiction of the respective Diocese where it shall happen to be (without Faculty or License for so doing first had or obtained from the Bp Court) And as Hampstead (aforesaid) does not appear to be exempted this Denomination with care.

Q - Your opinion therefore is desired if it be not necessary in order to avoid the Censure or Recusancy of the Bp of London or His Vicars to apply for a Faculty or License from His Court previous to the putting downe the present Church at Hampstead Building a new one there.

Q - Or whether from what occurs here relating to the Church of Hampstead being originally only a Chapel of Ease to St. Stephen and dependent on the Abbot & Convent of Westm^t are only a Devotional or personal Service &c & if your Honor deems the trustee appointed by the Abbot to take care of the present & proceed to build a new Church without being at the expence of proceeding such Faculty for a Revis^r Notwithstanding the Inhabitants (for a time) have been all licensed to attend to the Services, Devotions, or Juries by the Bp of London and as constantly seen used to be attended at this for the same being said as constantly seen used to be attended at this for the said Annual Visitation. And the Wardens being as long & regularly chosen by the Parish and likewise worn in and as punctually attended at the said Annual Visitation &c.

Q - Now your opinion is desired which is the safest Facult^y available method to pursue whither to be at the Charge of Faculty or to run the Hazard of a prosecution for omitting it (at the neighbouring Parish of Marybone have lately done and which is also a Devotional or Episcopal Curacy &c)

And it is agreed that all the Money to arise by letting any of the said Pews shall from time to time be employed for and towards the repairing of the said new intended Church & the same thereof together with any other Money that shall be raised by any other means for that purpose, and in the mean time till the said Money shall be laid out the same shall be invested in any Government Security by the said Trustees & the said Trustees or the Major part of them shall at the same Meeting in the next place, about the Month of June or Sept in the said new intended Church for every other Tenant or Inhabitant in the said Manors or Parish who shall subscribe and pay any sum under £50 towards building of the said Church to be enjoyed by them & any claiming under them and their respective Families in Manner and according to the Qualifications and

Restrictions as is before mentioned with respect to the Owners contributing the sum of £50 or upwards. And in the choice to be made of the said Pews as well as the setting out of the said other Pews & Seats regard is to be had to the largeness of the sum contributed by each Submitter & Reference is to be given to a Person contributing a large sum before any Person contributing a lesser sum; and in case two or more Persons shall severally contribute the like sum. Then the Officer setting out of the said Pews or seats between such Persons shall be settled & determined by Casting lots. And when ^{as of true} £50 of any of the said Pews or Seats to be let to any Persons contributing a sum less than £50 shall become vacant by any of the means as is before mentioned with respect to the said Pews to be let out for persons contributing of £50 or more & and every such Pew or Seat shall be let out for the said Contributors, shall be disposed of & such Persons placed to it in the same from time to time as the Lord or Lady of the said Manors for the time being & the Major part of the said Trustees for the time being shall think fit.

That whenever the said Trustees shall be reduced to Seven, including the Minister & Church wardens for the time being, the said surviving Seven or the Majority of them shall within 2 Months after the said Number of Fifteen are reduced to Seven, nominate & appoint from time to time, eight New Men qualified as aforesaid to be added and make up the Number of Fifteen. And the said Vice Illumination as well as other Transactions concerning the said new Church shall be entered from time to time in a Book to be kept for that purpose and signed by a Majority of the Trustees then present.
