Sr

Recd Your Letter of the 2^d of last Month and have since consulted my Attorney upon it, to know in what manner to take the security for the Money proposed to lend towards completing the Church. What he says is, That as the Money to arise by letting the Pews is by the Terms of the Subscription directed to be laid out in Repairing the Church and Chapel after the same shall be built, he thinks it can't be directed or applied (unless it be by a general agreement and indenture on the Back of the other) to any other use or purpose; and that it will not be advisable for the Trustees to consent to it, nor safe for me to advance the Money upon it. I should think it proper for the Trustees to take the opinion of Cownall in the Case and if the Opinion be that a proper Security can be made I shall be ready to lend the Money but I shall expect the Interest proposed being no more than what readily procure for any sum I shall be able to advance.
