 arise by letting the Pents is by the Terms of the Subscription directed
 to be laid out in Repairing the Church and Steeple after the same
 shall be built, he thinks it cannot be divided or applied (unless it be
 by a general agreement and indorsed on the Back of the other) to any
 other Use or purpose; and that it will not be advisable for the
 Trustees to consent to it, nor safe for me to advance the Money upon it.
 I should think it proper for the Trustees to take the Opinion of Counsel
 in the Case and if the Opinion be that a proper Security can be made
 I shall be very free to lend the Money but I shall expect the Interest
 proposed being no more than what Security procure for any sum
 I shall be able to advance

M^r Donbiggen delivered an Estimate to cover the Tower of a Church with Timber sufficient for that purpose & whole Deal, Nails, labour, & the use of the whole materials & to be kept shaven till July 1747 for Five Pound. And to make weather boards to the four Windows of the Bell Tower of Two Inch & a half Deal & to make to D^r a circular head weather board not more than one foot square & to be continued into the circular head completed & fixt up for the Sum of Nine Pound at a Estimated Sign.
