


# THE PARISH CHURCH OF ST JOHN-AT-HAMPSTEAD

The Minutes of last Meeting were read approved and confirmed, except what relates to the two Angels, which with the advice of M<sup>r</sup> Henderson are to be omitted;

The Ceremony was performed by M<sup>r</sup> Peter Lafranchon over the Scaffolding of the altar without the two Angels being thought sufficient.

M<sup>r</sup> Henderson the Surveyor having acquainted M<sup>r</sup> Vincent, M<sup>r</sup> Mael & M<sup>r</sup> Howard, that there was a quantity of Iron gates and Palliades to be sold, at the Dutch pit, at Commons, the fall of the Duke Chandos, some of which might be proper for the front of the Church yard towards Church row;

Agreed That M<sup>r</sup> Vincent & M<sup>r</sup> Mael be desired to go to Commons with M<sup>r</sup> Henderson, and view the above said Palliades & gates, and if approved of, to bid for and purchase as much here as they shall think proper for the purpose aforesaid.

M<sup>r</sup> Oliver attended with a Design for a Font and Pedestal of Marble — to be oval-shaped one foot & half in width by 2 feet — & proposed the doing it in a very good manner for twelve guineas or submit to a valuation — and also to receive and set up a Chimney Piece and slab of Portland Stone on the way at 18<sup>s</sup> per foot & sundries & Cartage of fire Stone at 12<sup>s</sup> per foot supposed the whole value about five guineas.

Ordered That M<sup>r</sup> Oliver perform the same accordingly

Referred the contents of M<sup>r</sup> Maryons letter to further consideration

John Sauer and M<sup>r</sup>. John James Church Wardens for the present Year that the following Seats or seats, according to the numbers Descriptions and Situations as are here after mentioned, be and shall be deemed and reputed as the absolute right and property of the present Minister and his Successors being Numbers 88, 92, 91, 90, 89 which with number 1 (being the Ministers, adjoining to the Vest) which are all on the south side of what is called, and is to be reputed as the Chancel of the said new Church, below Stairs, And on the north side of what is called the Chancel Numbers as follows N<sup>o</sup>s 2, 3, 4, (being double Seats) And Numbers 59, 60, 61 & 62 being what are called single pews on the said north side of the said Chancel (being all also below Stairs) And also in the North Gallery of the said Church Seats Numbers as follow N<sup>o</sup>s 19, 20, 21, & 22 (which together with three Seats joining at the back of N<sup>o</sup>s 20, 21 & 22) shall and are declared to be by the Trustees for building the said new Church, for the use and benefit of the Minister of Hampstead for the Time being
