Ordered that M^r Anne Bray shall have a Copy of our Grant June the 20th 1767 of an Annuity of Ten Pounds to be paid to her during her Life and William Bradshaw etc do sign the same

Resolved that the Hon^{ble} of the late Richard Westfield Esq Deceased in consideration of the sum of Twelve Pounds Twelve Shillings do consent and have approved to Grant a sufficient Quantity of Ground unto their Trustees from Church New Hampstead into the Ground now belonging Parish by Virtue of an Exchange settled in Publick New by with M. Guyon
 And as by the Purchase of such Ground of M. Westfield there a Little New thorough fare Road into Fognell will be acquired and Obtained for Publick Coach & Chaise and Coach Way only, and will be of great use to the Parish and Especially another great Advantage will arise by such Open New Road, as thereby all Cattle may be brought to and down near the Church as is much wanted

Therefore We as Trustees for the Church upon due Consideration of the same in Order to forward and Promote so Publick and Useful a Design have thought and do Agree to Dispose of the said Twelve Guineas for the Purchase of the said Ground Provided that the further Charges required in Fencing and Completing the Proposed New Road shall be Starved by Contribution or other ways AND it is our Opinion that the Lord of the Manor and also M. Guyon should be acquainted with our Resolution

And it is recommended that the Respective Inhabitants keeping Coach or Chaise and all others at least any ways benefited by such Road from their Situation should be applied unto to contribute

- Case 1. A Subscriber dies leaving two Sons; he devises his Estate at Hampstead to his older Son who lives out of the parish. The younger Son lives in the parish, having property there of his own.
 Q. How much of younger Son's right to his Father's free-
 hold can the latter Son give him any right?
 Case 2. A Subscriber devotes his Estate to B. who resides out of the parish, but lets one of his Houses to his Son who lives there.
 Q. Has his Son any right to such Subscriber's free-
 hold?
 Case 3. A Subscriber, being Possessor in the parish, which he has been
 necessary for several years; he is having a wife & Child
 who are settled in small Houses, they return & reside in the
 parish for a few months at a time, but not upon their own
 property.
 Q. Have they any right to the use of the free-
 hold during such occasional
 residence?

- Case 4. A Subscriber having no real property in the parish devotes his
 occasional Son; the older Son dies, leaving two Daughters who live out of
 the parish.
 Q. Have the younger Son any right to his free-
 hold or to the free-
 hold of the parish give them any right or would she have if she
 returned to the parish, have any right.

 in the articles I declared the same to be null & void in Law or Equity, as far as they are
 inconsistent with the Statute relating to the right of Electing & choosing Members...
 There is also determined that an agreement made by the Inhabitants of a parish of choice
 or enlarging a Chapel of Ease by subscription &c. for as the same consists with the
 nature & intention of the Statute may be enforced in a Court of Equity and that the Statute as well
 as to the Inhabitants may be subject to the Discretion of the Court in any irregularity
 of the agreement. But it is now considered that an agreement for disposing of the Estate in
 favour of the Church is good against the ordinary & ordinary of such an agreement is not
 the Statute. The Commissioners for the Affairs of Wales report to the Lords of the
 Privy Council the Commission for the Affairs of Wales, and that for double of this Act they are
 authorized by an Act of Parliament of the 3d year of King Charles the 2d to look into the
 Affairs of Wales & to take care that the Statute be observed in all things before any question
 of right comes to be contested between any of the parishes. Signed John Mordaunt

The following Opinion of the late Sir John Clarke was read & the said Sir John
 to be published in the paper of the 23rd of June, on his recommendation was agreed on to
 be published...
 By the 1st Article of the said Statute for Building the Church of Hampstead the
 intent of the said Statute is clearly to be seen, that in all cases any former
 buter of the sum of £20 or upwards of the making choice of a person to be
 new Church, or of any person or persons claiming under such contribution
 should in his or their capacity make and subscribe a sum of money or an allowance
 of the sum of £10 for which the said Statute is but not intended that they to be
 the or then their children and should move out of the said parish, & go to live
 in any other place, & that then whether the persons respectively paying any
 such money or the persons taking the same from him or her their re-
 moving out of the said parish should from thenceforth have the privilege or any
 right of electing or choosing a person to be a buter as is provided for the same
 but it is the intention of the said Statute that the same being by a majority
 of the Freeholders for the time being as they should think fit in the Statute.
 The late Sir John Clarke was consulted & he said about these matters
 that he understood that the Statute in Hampstead which should be inhibited
 and for which was a contribution that was made to Mr John Mordaunt by the
 said Statute it is to be seen that it does not inhibit within the parish of Hampstead
 staying further he had made choice of a person in the new Church his mother
 The words of the Statute relating to the Inhabitants are found very accurately
 and obviously that they were to have provided that the persons entitled to choose
 a person should not only include £20 or more but should be in person &c.

The Inhabitants in the Manor of Hampstead; and the subscribers thereto who desired
 whether they are to enjoy the free choice & election only so long as they continue to in-
 habit & reside in the parish they now reside in but forfeit the use of the free
 choice such non residence... I am therefore of opinion that the matter of
 the Question will not entirely depend on the non residence of the parties of
 choice of a person; for if she herself had known since the Statute in question she had made
 a choice of a person like not Inhabiting within the Manor of Hampstead I am
 inclined to think she would not have waited a qualification necessary to choose
 a person to be a person in the parish of Hampstead with respect to the Statute
 Reason to prevent Mr Mordaunt her Son's being entitled even supposing no
 objection to arise from the Statute's being before she had chosen a person
