Mr Jm: Don the Surveyor of the Manor attended with the written agreement enter'd into by the Ward of the Manor, & the several Subscribers which he desired to have extremely defective in point of Subscriptions & that there is an absolute necessity for an Act of Parliament to mend the Church in the Ward of the Manor & the several Trustees for certain purposes therein mentioned.

Order'd that the Trustees meet at the same place for the further consideration of the steps necessary to be taken in regard to obtaining the said Act of Parliament on Monday the 21<sup>st</sup> of July Instant

- "At a meeting of the Trustees of the Church of Hampstead held at the Long Room respecting the payment of pew Rents Mr J<sup>r</sup> H<sup>r</sup>ford & Mr Lancaster & Mr Abel attended and represented to the Trustees that their opinion of the Debt originally entered in for rebuilding the Church was this
- "That the pews should be let out to the Inhabitants and the money arising therefrom should be applied to the repayment of any sums which might be borrowed, but that when such sums were so paid off and no further encumbrance remained, then the Inhabitants should be accommodated with pews in the Church at the direction of the Church Wardens, as in other Churches, without any expense, and the further Repair of the Church should be made good by the Inhabitants at large by an equal Rate, therefore they have begged the payment as well for the foregoing Reasons as from an Information that some other pews were taken to belong to the Trust are occupied without payment for the same
