held in the Vestry Room of such Church on Sunday  
the 11 Day of August 1810.

The Minutes of the last Meeting were read  
and Confirmed.

The Meeting was held pursuant to a Notice published in the Church and Chapel on Sunday last and on this Day and to Notice sent to the respective Trustees on general Business.

At this Meeting the Trustees proceeded to take  
into Consideration the Appointment of one competent  
Person to officiate as Sexton at the Church at a Salary  
to be stipulated for that purpose and the Duties of such  
Office not being defined nor the Fees or Emoluments  
thereof ascertained it was therefore -

*Resolved* - That a Committee be appointed to recommend  
some Person or Persons competent to officiate as Sexton  
at the Church to fulfil the Duties and ascertain the Fees  
or Emoluments of such Office to stipulate for or recommend  
the proper Salary to be allowed for the same and to  
inquire into all other particulars relating thereto. That  
George Collings Esquire, Henry White Esquire and The Rev<sup>d</sup>  
Doctor White together with the two Churchwardens viz -

Mr Richard Starford and Mr William Greening Esq  
and they are hereby appointed such Committee and that  
such Committee do make their Report to the Trustees  
on such respective Matters at a Meeting to be called  
for the purpose.

At this Meeting it was reported to the Trustees that  
Locks had been placed on the Doors of some of the  
Trust Pew by the Holders thereof and that such Pews  
were usually kept locked not only while such Holders  
remained in the Parish but also during the Absence  
of the Family from the Parish and thereupon it was

*Resolved* - That no Lock be permitted to be placed or  
kept on the Door of any of the Trust Pews and where-  
any Locks are now so placed that the Secretary  
do send Notice to the Holders of such Pews -  
requesting them to desist from locking up the same  
in future and that the Secretary do communicate to  
all Pewmises who shall hereafter take any Pew belonging  
to the Trustees that the same will not be permitted  
to be kept locked on any account whatever.

This Meeting was held pursuant to Notice - published in the Church and Chapel on Sunday last and on the Day and to Notice sent to the Trustees in general Business and to receive the Report of the Committee concerning the Appointment of a competent Person to officiate at the Church.

At this Meeting the Proceedings of such Committee were read and a Copy of the same ordered to be inserted among the Minutes of this Meeting as the Return of such Committee of which Proceeding the Summons is such Copy. - "At a Meeting of the Committee nominated by the Trustees of the Church of Saint John Gampstead in the County of Middlesex held in the Vestry Room of such Church on Saturday the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1816 Present Mr. Wm. D. White In the Chair George Collings Esquire Henry White Esquire Mr. Richard Turford and Mr. William Greenway Surveyor - The Committee proceeded to ascertain the sum or Encumbrance of the Service intended to be officiated to officiate so Sexton at the Church and it was upon appearing that such sum or Encumbrance with from the Old and the New Ground were not more than an sufficient to satisfy such Person for the Labour to be performed at such Grounds and it appearing to the Committee that the sum of the Duties was inadequate to the Payment of such Person for the whole of the Duties mentioned in the Minutes of the last Committee Meeting and that no other sum appeared to the Committee applicable and adequate to the Payment thereof, the Committee therefore recommended that the Duties of the Person so to be appointed be confined to the Church Daily only as follows

"every Sunday and also on Christmas Day Good Friday Easter Day and Bank Holiday Days to attend the Minister in his Church Daily in each of those Days both in the Church and the Burying Ground to superintend the Pew Officers and occasionally to act as such to provide under his Directions of the Church Wardens Candles for lighting the Church, also Bread and Wine and other necessaries for the Communion and Water for Baptism and to see that the Bell Ringers particularly do their Duty on the before mentioned Days to give notice to the Clerk and Bellringers of all Deaths and Funerals to attend all Funerals to superintend and Direct the Opening of all Vaults and Graves and also the making of all New Vaults and Graves and also all Works that may be necessary to be done in the Church Yard to prevent all Necessities and Annoyances therein and to cause that no Dogs and all Cattle are kept out of the same Adjourned to Wednesday next the 13<sup>th</sup> instant to meet in the Committee Room at the Workhouse precisely at half past Nine o'clock in the forenoon -

"At a Meeting of the Committee nominated by the Trustees of the Church of Saint John Gampstead in the County of Middlesex held in the Committee Room at the Workhouse on Thursday the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of August 1816 Present Mr. Wm. D. White In the Chair George Collings Esquire Henry White Esquire Mr. Richard Turford and Mr. William Greenway Surveyor - The Committee proceeded to ascertain the sum or Encumbrance of the Service intended to be officiated to officiate so Sexton at the Church and it was upon appearing that such sum or Encumbrance with from the Old and the New Ground were not more than an sufficient to satisfy such Person for the Labour to be performed at such Grounds and it appearing to the Committee that the sum of the Duties was inadequate to the Payment of such Person for the whole of the Duties mentioned in the Minutes of the last Committee Meeting and that no other sum appeared to the Committee applicable and adequate to the Payment thereof, the Committee therefore recommended that the Duties of the Person so to be appointed be confined to the Church Daily only as follows

"To attend the Church during Divine Service both Morning and Evening every Sunday and also on Christmas Day Good Friday Lent Days and Thanksgiving Days to attend the Minister in his Church Duty on each of those Days both in the Church and the Vestry  
"To Superintend the Pew-Spurves and occasionally to act as such  
"and to see that the Collector or punctually discharges his Duty  
"on the days mentioned above - That the Person so appointed  
"for such Duties be allowed a salary not exceeding Fifty  
"Pounds per annum for the Performance thereof and that  
"the Committee do meet on Thursday the 22<sup>d</sup> instant at Two  
"Clock in the Evening preceding to consider and  
"choose a suit for the above as Candidate for the Office  
"That the Secretary do give Notice of each Committee Meeting  
"opportunity the same to be fixed in the Church and Chapel  
"Door and thereby communicate to such persons that the  
"Duties to be performed and the Salary so allowed may be  
"known by applying to the Secretary - That the usual Notice  
"be given for a General Meeting of the Trustees on Saturday the  
"22<sup>d</sup> of August instant at the Schoolroom in the Vicarage  
"to receive the Report of the Committee - Adjourned to  
"Thursday next the 22<sup>d</sup> instant to meet in the Committee  
"Room at the Vicarage, precisely at Seven o'clock in the Evening.

"At a Meeting of the Committee nominative by the  
"Trustees of the Charity Saint John's Hospital in the County  
"of Middlesex held in the Committee room at the Vicarage  
"on Saturday the 22<sup>d</sup> of August 1811 - Present George Collins  
"Chairman of the Share - Mr. Newell - Henry White Esq.  
"Mr. Richard Harford and Mr. William Grattan - Chartered  
"The Committee proceeded to see and examine each Person who  
"had offered themselves as Candidates to officiate as Sexton at  
"the Church in the Duties and at the Meeting mentioned in the  
"Minutes of the last Committee Meeting - of which Persons  
"and Examining the following are the Particulars viz  
"Francis Clements - aged 50 - Water Carrier - Lays off  
"at Highgate - Non Dissenting and not married - Thomas Hunt  
"Asterble and willing and can give adequate Security of required

"for the Discharge of his Duty and if appointed will not act as  
"Beaver or Bell-Ringer - Nor be Employed in Grave Digging and other  
"Works when acting as Sexton and will Conduct himself with  
"Sobriety and Cleanliness fitting the Situation - Thomas Braine  
"proposed - but neither he nor any one of them attended the  
"Committee - Abel Collier Aged 52 - Lives in the Vicarage Room  
"partly as a Lawyer - And after Seeing and Examining the Person  
"attending and offering themselves for the said Office and also  
"upon taking the same and also the Duties of such Office into  
"Consideration it was Resolved unanimously

"That it be recommended to the Trustees that the Person  
"so appointed to officiate as Sexton be appointed to the  
"Church and -  
"That the Committee recommend Thomas Hunt as the  
"Person so to be appointed, to employ to set and Conduct  
"himself in the manner specified in his Application -  
"That in case the said Thomas Hunt is appointed and  
"so far as rendered incapable to act as Bell-Ringer that he  
"will use his Endeavours to conduct  
"in the time of Bell Ringing - Adjourned - It having been  
"such Agreement been made and communicated to the Committee  
"that Samuel Hunt had offered himself to some of the Committee  
"as a Candidate for the said Office I had been in attendance during  
"the whole of the Meeting but by some mistake his name was not  
"put down made known to the Committee before the foregoing  
"Proceedings and Adjournment had taken place - he afterwards  
"appeared before the Members of the Committee and was informed of  
"what had been done and of the Duties of the Office he is aged 50 - has  
"a large and Three Children - Lived Seven Years with Mr.  
"Mair - Nine Years with Mr. Longman and Three years since  
"with Mr. Hunter at London - has been ill and out of Place  
"a considerable time - Now employed occasionally as a Waiter  
"thinks himself competent for the Situation and is willing to  
"accept it - and therefore it was -  
"Ordered - That the Consideration of such Report and appointment be  
"postponed until the next General Meeting  
"Adjourned to Sunday the 5<sup>d</sup> October next to meet in the  
"Meeting Room previously at One o'Clock -

is or has been a Procurator residing in the Parish  
be considered as most eligible. That the Person to be  
recommended is to be considered as the Superintendent  
of the Pew Offices and as Verger of the Church. That  
the Duties of the Office be communicated to him by  
the Secretary and that the Committee do make  
their Report to the Trustees at their next general  
Meeting.

pursuance of the Resolution of the Trustees passed at  
this General Meeting held on the 8<sup>th</sup> of July 1816 do  
commence from Michaelmas last and that Achibald  
Richardson who from that time has acted as such  
Bell Ringer be confirmed in that Office.*

*At this Meeting it was reported by the Committee  
appointed or continued at the last general Meeting that*

M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Brain of this Parish had been considered by them as a fit and proper Person to be employed as Superintendent of the Pew openers and as Lector of the Church and whereupon he was approved of as such by the Trustees at this Meeting, but the Funds of the Trustees being deemed inadequate as well as unappropriate to the Payment of his Salary it was-

Resolved -

That the Appointment of such a Person be at present postponed.

At this Meeting a Claim was made by Thomas Wilson Esquire of the Sum of £150 being about one Moity of the Expenses incurred by him in and about the building of a New Wall on the East Side of the Church yard as a fence thereto which Claim was at a Meeting held on the 19 of July 1810 considered as reasonable and to be within the Intention of the last two Trust Deeds; and upon taking the same into Consideration it was-

Resolved -

That the Determination on such Claim be postponed until the next General Meeting.

At this Meeting Michael Turner Esquire who is due to reside in this Parish made a Claim to a Pew in the Church which had been allotted to John Turner Esquire deceased as an original Subscriber and requested a Copy of the Trust Deed provided his Claim should be considered as insufficient and whereupon it was -

Resolved -

That the Claim made by the said Michael Turner appears to the Trustees to be insufficient inasmuch as he does not appear to be a Tenant within the Description of Persons mentioned in the Subscription Deed and the Secretary was directed at the request of the said Mich<sup>r</sup> Turner and at his expense to furnish him with an Extract of so much of such Deed as related to the Claim made by him -

This Meeting was held pursuant to Adjournment to Notice published in the Church and Chapel on Sunday last and on this Day and to Notice sent to the Trustees on general Business -

At this Meeting the Trustees again took into consideration the Claim of Thomas Wilson Esquire respecting the Expenses incurred by him in building the Fence Wall on the East Side of the Church yard and whereupon it was -

Resolved -

That such Claim be allowed. That the Producer do pay to the said Thomas Wilson the Sum of £150 as a reasonable Compensation towards such Expenses and that such Sum of £150 or so much thereof as shall be necessary be paid by Sale of a Competent part of the Bank Annuities now belonging to the Trustees.

At this Meeting it was reported by the Secretary that in pursuance of the Resolution of the Trustees -

passed at their last General Meeting he had furnished  
Michael Parmer Esquire at his request with an Extract  
of so much of the Subscription Deed as related to -  
the Allotment of Pews to the Lord of the Manor, the  
Minister of the Parish and the Subscribers of £50--  
each or upwards and that the said Michael Parmer  
had requested a Copy of the Whole of the Deed so as  
to enable him to ascertain the prescribed Authorities  
of the Trustees, but inasmuch as such Deed contained  
no additional Matter or Information respecting the  
Claim of any Subscriber or those claiming under such  
Subscriber it was.

Resolved -

That the Secretary do communicate to the said  
Michael Parmer that his further Request cannot be  
complied with and that the Secretary do also inform  
him that his Name will be entered for a Trustee  
and he will be accommodated at the first opportunity of  
the Trustees -

At this Meeting a Letter from Mr. Stoney Craggs the  
Organist was laid before the Trustees and read and a  
Copy thereof Ordered to be Entered among the Minutes of  
this Meeting, of which Letter the following is such Copy  
viz: " 24 South Street Hendon Square - Sir - Having been  
engaged by you to give my Answer in Writing to your  
Communication from the Trustees of Hampstead Church -  
respecting the Increase of Duty required by them, of -  
Attendance during the Week for the purpose of Instructing -  
the Children in Singing; as I cannot suppose it to be -  
the Intention of the Trustees that I should have this -  
Additional Trouble without an adequate Remuneration -  
I have no Hesitation in stating my Willingness to comply

"with their Wishes. Should not be their Indulgence as it  
"would be attended with considerable Expence and loss of  
"Time in Justice to myself I shall be under the Necessity -  
"of requesting them to accept my Resignation. I have the  
"Honor to be Sir your very Obedient Servt Henry Braggs  
"3. May 1817. The Rev: D: White" And upon reading such  
Letter and upon a general Representation made to the  
Trustees that the Children had not been instructed in  
Singing by the Organist agreeably to his original  
Engagement and the Trustees being of opinion that the  
present Salary was adequate to the Performance of all  
the Duties required of the Organist it was -

*Resolved*

That no Increase be made to such Salary, and  
that the Trustees do accept the Resignation of the  
said Henry Braggs as such Organist bid to continue  
his Salary until Michaelmas next And that any  
Organist to be elected in future will be expected to  
Instruct the Children in Singing One Hour at least in  
every Week, /

Minutes of this Meeting and of which offer the following  
is such Copy viz... "Holly Bush Hall Nov: 22. 1847.  
"To the Trustees of Hampstead Church Gentlemen Having  
"declared myself a Candidate for the Situation of Organist  
"of Hampstead Church, to each Gentleman of the Church  
"I said I now beg leave to report that declaration, and  
"to offer a few observations relative to the duties of that  
"Office, which I pledge myself to perform, should I be so  
"fortunate as to be chosen to succeed the late Organist  
"I conceive it to be Gentleman, one of the principal  
"duties of an Organist to instruct his Children in the  
"proper Method of Singing the Plain Psalm Tune;  
"which I apprehend to be not only preserving them the faithful  
"adherence to the tune or Air, but also the proper  
"pronunciation & enunciation of the words, which is but  
"too often, utterly neglected. — To carry this into  
"effect it would be advisable to select about twelve of the  
"Boys, & the same number of Girls, in the first instance,  
"to give them a true idea of the part they are to take,  
"that when they are perfect, or at least have made some  
"progress, they may be considered as leaders to the rest  
— This being done, which I will readily undertake to do  
"if I may command their Attention twice a week, the  
"Boys one day & the Girls another (until they are brought  
"into proper training, when once a week will do) The  
"remaining Children may be added by degrees, by three  
"four or five at a time; until all join in the publick

"service of offering up their praises to the present Deity —  
— The Congregation would then, I think, I may be allowed  
"to say, have pleasure in listening to and perhaps in joining  
"with voice in the plain Psalm tune, & thus would the  
"Church of God become a glorious one, wherein all the  
"assembled people might rejoice, being animated by  
"the same Spirit, the Spirit of God, of love & sacred  
"harmony — I may leave further to observe that should  
"it be the wish of the Gentlemen of the Church, I trust to have  
"the Recitation to the Commandments chanted a Morning  
"or Evening Psalm performed or any other addition or  
"alteration in the present mode of conducting the Choral  
"part of the Church Service, I shall be most happy to make  
"every effort in my power towards the accomplishment  
"of their almost wishes — I have the honor to be Gentlemen  
"Your most Obedient & humble Servt C. A. Firth"

At this Meeting a Letter from the Clerk to Rev<sup>d</sup> Edw<sup>r</sup> Aston Curate the Vicar was read before the Trustees, which having been read, a Copy thereof was ordered to be Entered among the Minutes of this Meeting, of which the following is such Copy Viz: "At the Sunday Morning 19 September 1819 - Gentlemen although the warm Weather of the present Year, may probably be past, I cannot refrain from calling your Attention to so many Drawings in the Church this Morning owing to the want of Ventilation in a Building happily so well occupied by a full Congregation - allow me also to State that your Ministers almost always, during some Months at least in the year find it necessary in the Vestry when they come out between the parts of Divine Service - The want of Air may be easily remedied by making the Windows open obliquely, as in most of the large Churches in London and the Sides are guarded by lengths of Glass so as to save those near from any current of Air while it is thrown up towards the Roof where the vapours hang; - I am very sure our Neighbour Mr. Henry Wise would visit the Church of St. Martin the Valdes; and that a small Expence would make ones equally free from offensive heat without inconveniencing any of us, saving the Health and Comfort of one Parish ought no longer to suffer for any pecuniary Considerations or thought of Convenience attending the Alteration which a week might complete - I must apologize for bringing another request before you which I laid before the last Vestry Meeting; the absolute Necessity of Pews in our old Church yard, distant from each other - The Pew Owners might keep Keys for Females; the Beadle for the Men. Every Sunday and

" every Prayer Day, such Conveniences are wanted by those - coming from a Distance more especially by Women coming to return Thanks after Childbirth - I have, and have had a large Family of my own, therefore no false Shame shall prevent these Suggestions being laid before you which I have long been anxious to do for the public Benefit - I am completing the first half year of my Curacy and being myself often in the Church and Vestry five Hours at a Time on various Duties, I behold more Illness and Distress from these Inconveniences than yourselves would conceive - My letter being explanatory, is naturally longer than I could wish to trouble you with - Whether my Applications succeed or fail I have Satisfaction in doing my Duty as one of the Ministers of your Church and as much in subscribing myself Gentleman Your faithful Servt. E. J. Turner - Curate - The Trustees of Hampstead Church" - and upon taking such Applications into Consideration it was -

*Resolved.* That the Determination thereon be postponed and that Henry Wise Esquire be requested to ascertain the Expence of altering the Windows in the Manner proposed, and also the Expence of making a Water Closet in or near the South-East Corner of the Church with a Drain from the same and that he be requested to make his Report theron to the Trustees at their next General Meeting -
