Mr. Vallis's Report of the State of the Works of the repairs of the Church was read and ordered to be returned.

Report on the State of the Works of the repairs of Stumpfield Church.

"The Reg'd fire Tower and exterior of the Building are nearly all completed. The paving in side Aisles is laid and the Hot Water apparatus is all fixed. — There is a large aperture in the back of the Vault (6 feet by 7 feet) in front of the Communion Table which has been covered with wood-boards and upon those the paving of the Aisle has been laid.

"This arrangement appears to me very objectionable because it endangers the health of the congregation and because the paving, steps to the Choir and Chancel are injured by the wood giving way — As the Vault is nearly full I should recommend that the Arch

be bricked up; or if that cannot be allowed
that the aperture in the brick work be contracted
and a proper covering of Stone set into rebates
with Rings to raise them by and made as
light as being said whenever they have been
taken up with Mortar - This must be removing
what is at present objectionable & of course more
expensive than the other. We intended
nevertheless but have not had any Orders
respecting it) to form an arched Vault under
the Porch at the West End of the Church which
to communicate with the Vault now in the
Church by a doorway cut through the external
Foundation Wall. I would beg to see if the
Trustees wish me to take this work under
my direction and superintendance? I also
understand it to be the wish of Mr White that
there should be a Row formed for the Congregation
and pavement under the Porch at the foot of
the Stair, to project forward about a foot into
the Vestib. I beg to see if it be the wish of the
Trustees that this should be done. I William
Arch. Regent St. Aug. 12. 1834 - To the Trustees
of the Church of St. James Church."

Report on the Appropriation of the Ground lately
purchased in Perrins Court - August 2. 1834.

"I have looked at the Ground in Perrins
Court with a view to the being laid out as an
approach to the Church for feet passengers and
and the improvement cannot be made complete
on account of the first piece of the Lane from the
High Street not being in the possession of the Trust.
The Plan I should propose to the Trustees would
be to erect a Wall of Sixteen Feet (with Piers) 6
Feet high above the ground on the South side of
the Ground between it and the Gardens; but in
the parts where there are Buildings adjoining a
Wall 3 Feet high would be sufficient to detain
the objection of the property & to prevent Doors being
made into the Parish Ground. If the Trustees
cannot prevent the Dr. Priests obtaining a Right
of Light from their Grounds they must within a
certain time build up the Wall so as to block out
the Windows ^{from} into their Premises. The whole length
of Wall should be covered with Bricks on edge in

"Correct; the part against the Gardens covered
 at left with wooden gates bedded in mortar.
 On the north side and between the Parish Ground
 and the Footpath a close boarded fence 6 feet
 high should be erected; finished at left with
 a greened Colliery with flutes in it, the fence
 should either be formed with feather edged close
 boards about 3 inches & the same, and the
 whole well painted; or a common close Park
 Boarding of Seven Oaks the tops painted and covered
 with white paper or paper glazed to three parts of
 the same but not painted; in both cases a top
 of the wood, is necessary. - Should not
 should recommend a fence 6 feet high of green
 Painted the tops protected by leaded boards with
 gates called a "Patriotic" Gate which admits
 horses one at a time but keeps out Cattle &
 these should be made to lock and the whole
 well painted. I would not be necessary I
 should think to have a Carrion Gate. The
 ground should be levelled and formed
 sloping from the middle to the sides and
 a covering of 2 1/2 inch bedded earth being 4 feet
 across laid all along in the centre. On each side
 3 inches of good grass should be laid & well
 watered covering all the space not occupied by
 the paving. Signed William Smith - To
 the Trustees of St. Andrew's Church."

I will be of the favor of you to lay this proposal before the Trustees, and to let me have their decision upon it. I observe the Ground is dug for the Vault under the Terrace at the West End of the Church but exposed to the direction of the Trustees conveyed to me in your Letter of the 10th Inst. I have not taken the work under my direction and superintendance - I remain Dear Sir very truly yours - William Theobald Esq^r

with Trees on each side leaving a space of not less than seven feet in width between for a path or foot way to the Church

Suggestions and Observations submitted
for the consideration of the Trustees of
Stamsted Church.

1. To increase the quantity of Graining work
particularly in the Gallery; by Graining all the
Partitions that are seen from below, the fronts
of Pews near the Passage, the wainscoting
against the Walls, the wainscoting against
the Walls on Ground Floor, and all the capping
and knee boards and insides of Pew Doors. -
N.B. Graining is to be preferred to plain painting.

on many accounts the only objection to it is the expense.

The East of the above will be 209.3.6

2^d - To compare the North of the walls outside of Entrance on West Front - to correspond with the new North of the Tower in the Centre and to continue the new Gable North to the West - projections on the North and South sides of Church

The expense of this will be about 22.0.0

3^d - The joining in front of the Church part of the East End up to the Gable is in a bad state it has sunk and is much broken it should be taken up the plan of it recommended and raised with some new timber where requisite. The Pavement under and in front of the Church part of the East End is in a bad state but possibly it may be worth the trouble of the Rent to repair it.

4th - It has been suggested that the Church opposite the Organ is an unsightly spot and that it should not remain as it is. I am not aware of any mode of restoring it to the simple state of a square of a Church. It cannot be raised up either on the inside the Tower or in front of the recess at the angle of the window. The projection of the pavilion were taken in raising the doors, would be preferable as it would be entirely out of sight.

5th - It is stated that the Organist wishes for more space in front of the Organ on account of the organ being for the additional Organ and Organ moving forward. The two doors in front of the Organ which would contract the width of the two front doors. The two doors are now nearly as wide they would be made still wider narrower. It would be much improved by the line of drawing being broken and interrupted. It should therefore

suggest that the whole Instrument might be moved further west, whereby the object would be gained and the feet of the Church improved.

6th - The Flue from the Hot Water Apparatus has been raised (and by my order) in a Chimney above the Roof instead of being level with the Parapet. I would think the Trustees should not at that if they think it objectionable it may be altered.

7th - The Chimney being raised above the Parapet is not necessary for the draft but was done to keep the smoke off the Roof. Leave Military Architect - General Staff 1834
