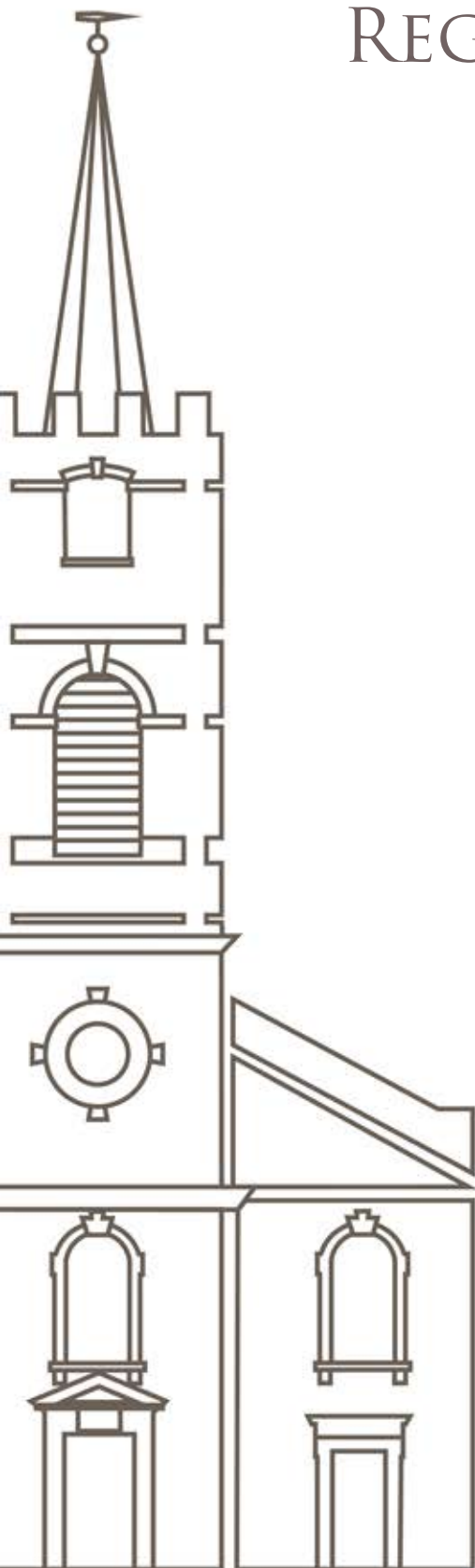


THE PARISH CHURCH OF ST JOHN-AT-HAMPSTEAD

The Churchwardens reported that at a Vestry holden on the 21 September 1887 the following Resolution was passed. "That in the opinion of this Vestry it is essentially necessary for the protection of property that a new Fire Engine of sufficient size with Fire Ladders Buckets and Axes be obtained for the use of the Parish, that the Trustees of the Church be requested to provide the same together with an Engine House and a competent superintendent and to defray the expense thereof under the powers vested in the said Trustees by the Local Church Act, and that the Churchwardens be authorized and requested to sell the two Parish Engines (which are insufficient in size and quality) and to pay over the Proceeds thereof to the Trustees of the Church in aid of the Funds necessary for the purchase of the New Engine.

The Churchwardens also reported that at a Vestry holden on the 15th of December 1887 a Resolution was passed authorizing and requesting the Trustees to borrow under the powers of the Local Act such sum or sums of money as they (the Trustees) shall judge necessary, but not exceeding in the whole £200, for the purposes of providing and keeping a Fire Engine Engine House Fire Ladders and other necessary Implements of Fire and of employing a competent person to superintend the Engine and for defraying incidental expenses.

An Estimate by J. Merryweather of 63 Long Lane of the expense of building a new Fire Engine for 10 Horses on the Patent and most improved principle with two dozen fire buckets six lengths of leather pipe forty feet each and a set of six fire ladders amounting in the whole to £127 and an Estimate of the value of the two old fire Engines and appurtenances amounting to fifteen Pounds were submitted to the Board.

That the Churchwardens be requested to ascertain from Mr. Merryweather the cost of hiring for one year a proper Fire Engine and Appurtenances.
