To the Trustees of Saint Johns Church Hampetead

In accordance with the instructions received from a Committee of your body which I attended yesterday and having reference to the four report made by M'Gilbert Scott and myself on 5th February 1868 with regard to the safety of the Tower I beg further to report as follows.

Its we then apprehended, the downward ~ movement of the Tower has continued during the last live years, and various new cracks and fractures and considerable extensions of the old ones are very observable

and with reference to the question that were fut to me to be apprehended from the continuous subsidence

That it is certainly not a disable to incur the considerable cost and inconvenience of underpinning

the Tower which would require to be substantially shored up during the operations, the excavations and shoring occupying the starcase wings and part of the interior of the Church. I therefore . consider it advisable that the Tower should be

The Starcase wings on either side of the Tower have not only been dragged downwards by the Tower, but the foundations of the Walls are elsewhere defective, and cracks and pactures appear therein besides those caused by the ~ subsidence of the Tower. The floors, steps and landings are also considerably out of level. The taking down of the Tower would necessarily involve a partial rebuilding of the Staircase winep and it is obviously desirable that they too should be wholly taken down together with
