Sent.

In answer to a letter from the Elesk your Surveyor

stated that he could only quarantee that the Buttreeses proposed by him would ensure the safety of the wall from 6 to 8 years.

Your Committee have carefully considered \_ your Surveyors Trepost and the allemative of pubulding or reparing the wall in queetion and fall confident in view of the short term during which your Surveyor can quarantee the safety of the wall, if repared, confled with the outstands question of the ownership of the wall that the most foundent and truly economical Scheme is to probable the wall and thus effect a permanent
