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The Registers of Baptisms, Marriages and Burials are from 1560 to 1842. Civil Registration began in England in 1837. The Trustees Minute Books are from 1744 to 1934.

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to account for any copies that he sold at 2/- without any further commission, the arrangement up to now, having been, 2/- in the selling & commission of 15% on the net price of 3/4 each.

Resolved, that the price be reduced to 2/- and that notice be put at the church door and in Parish Magazine & an effort made to sell copies privately.

Mr Slyn reported that £156 was still required to meet the estimated cost of the church improvements. The architect had been asked to obtain & check all the accounts so that the exact figures might be ascertained. It was known that some of the estimates would be exceeded so that notwithstanding the estimated extras, it seemed probable that the £1204 named in the Trustees' last appeal would not cover the actual cost.

The Vicar reported that Mr Spiers had presented a grand piano for use in the choir vestry. It was moved, seconded & carried unanimously that the best thanks of the Trustees be given to Mr Spiers for his generous and useful gift. Mr Grace being desired to communicate this resolution to Mr Spiers.

Mr Slyn reported that the churchwardens had viewed the accounts of the previous quarter. I found them in order. They had also examined the cash statement for the current quarter - the only item which called for remarks was the account sent in by Messrs Goldridge for printing the monthly service papers - the charge was in excess of that which had usually been paid. Some explanation was desirable - the Vicar promised to enquire into the matter.

Moved by Mr Slyn. Seconded by Mr Griffith &  
Resolved that the above statement of accounts be received & adopted.

Mr Grace reported that he had sold 40 copies of Mr Kennedy's book & had forwarded a cheque for £5 to the Treasurer of the "Church Improvement Fund".

Mr Slyn reported that he had received a letter from Messrs Snell & Powers, asking

permission to copy the old Parish Registers. The copies would be published in book form which would include the most interesting inscriptions in the Church Yard & those on the Memorial Tablets in the Church. No expense would be incurred by the Vicar or Churchwardens.

The Trustees agreed to leave the matter in the hands of the Vicar & Churchwardens, & suggested that should the offer of Messrs. Snell & Jowers be accepted. The work might be done at the Public Record Office, where the Registers would be safe guarded.

Mr. Slyn reported that there still remained a sum of £98 required to complete the amount named in the last appeal for the Church Improvement Fund. The Arbitrator thought that in about a month, a definite statement of accounts could be rendered.

Mr. Slyn also reported that £50 had been paid off the £250 loan.

The Vicar explained his views with regard  
 to the formation of a Church Council,  
 which he did not propose should interfere

with the duties of the Church Trustees, but  
 be a representative Body, useful in  
 discussing and advising on various parochial  
 affairs which might, from time to time,  
 require consideration. Such a Body  
 also offered an excellent way of keeping  
 in touch with the laity.

The Church Trustees to be ex officio members  
 of the Council which should consist also  
 of the Suddsmen & others to be co-opted.  
 After some discussion, it was moved  
 by Dr. Jessop, seconded by Mr. Calkin &

Resolved, that the Trustees oppose the formation  
 of a Church Council.

It was suggested that the Council should  
 consist of the Church Trustees & Suddsmen,  
 & 20 elected or co-opted members, the latter  
 to consist of 10 men & 10 women.

The Vicar reported that thanks to the  
 generosity of a member of the congregation,  
 pews had been provided for several  
 free seats in the church.

 sent to the Vicar or Parochial Treasurer,

Commission on School Subscriptions to be  
 continued as before.

They estimated there would be a considerable saving by an electric blower which they offered to supply & fit, exclusive of structural alterations & wiring for £ 167.

The Vicar urged the desirability of arranging for the installation of electric blowing when the repairs to the Organ were done, the Church Council had agreed to these repairs being carried out.

Willis & Son to clean the Organ & renovate the pedal board for £62 be accepted. & on the motion of Mr. Bell, seconded by Mr. Negretti, it was also resolved <sup>with one dissentient</sup> ~~by a majority~~ that their offer to fit an electric blower for £16 be accepted.

The question of borrowing such money as might be required to meet the cost was referred to the Churchwardens.
