The following Report prepared
by the Sub-Committee appointed to
consider the condition of the Church
Yard, was read by Mr. Neale Ward.

" We have carefully examined the state
of the Headstones & Monuments, and the
general condition of the Church Yard
around the church.

" There are a considerable number of
Monuments of real interest, which
should be put into a state of repair;
They are good examples of the art
of the eighteenth and nineteenth
Centuries, and should be preserved
as worthy of the period.

" The majority of the graves have Headstones
only, some very good in design and
workmanship; a great many of these
have fallen out of place owing
to having no secure foundations.

" It would be a simple matter to put
these upright, but the point to consider
is that there are a great many in
this state.

" As to the larger Monuments, it might be
well to try and discover their owners, with
a view to their undertaking the cost
of the necessary repairs; a search of
the Church Records or an advertisement
in the Times might prove effective
to this end.

" Some of the railings round the Tombs

" have become so decayed that it is
" only possible to clear them away.
" They are fallen away already; others
" can be scraped and painted.
" Generally, the paths and grass and trees
" should be kept in a more trimmed
" condition, and the boundary fences
" and walls, particularly on the South
" side, require repairs and renewal in
" places.
" We therefore recommend the Trustees
" as follows:-
1. To cut and keep the grass at a
" reasonable level and repair and attend
" to the paths. To remove all growths
" and debris round tombs and cut
" overhanging branches of trees which
" are detrimental to the Churchyard.
2. To take down Headstones which
" are out of the vertical and replace
" them in concrete beds.
3. To renew fence on south boundary
4. To brush and paint iron railings
" surrounding tombs where necessary,
" and repair boundary walls.
5. To repair brick and stone tanks
" where necessary.
As regards cost, we consider that if
the Trustees will authorise the
expenditure of £100, that a start
could be made on items 1, 2, 3 and 4,
and 5 will come on later.

Mr. Glynn expressed his opinion that according to the Burial Act of 1853, the Borough Council was responsible for the upkeep of the Churchyard including the necessary repairs to surrounding walls and fence, for cutting the grass & possibly attending to the Monuments & Tombstones, and suggested that before taking action the Trustees should obtain the opinion of Mr. Morris on the subject.

Moved by Mr. Griffith, seconded by Mr. Plumpton that Mr. Morris be asked to report whether under the Burials Act 1853 the Borough Council is responsible for putting up a new fence on the South side of the Churchyard or cause the owners to do so, to keep the Burial ground in order, that is, cut the grass, trees, and undergrowth, & if so, to ask the Council to take immediate action - if not, that up to £50 be spent on cutting the grass, trees & undergrowth & putting the head-stones upright.

The matter to be left in the hands of the sub-committee.

Mr. Glyn reported that of the £1200 required for the War Memorial only £500 had been received.

Some modification of the original design appeared to be inevitable.

It was reported that George Tubs, the late Gardener had been paid £57-17-0 during the present year.

Moved by Mr. Coates, seconded by Mr. Moreland, that half pay be continued until Christmas next, when the matter would be again considered.

Mr. Glyn reported that Mr. Monroe had been consulted as to how far the Borough Council was responsible for the upkeep of the Churchyard.

Mr. Moore being a Church Trustee had thought it better to pass the matter over to his partner Mr. Sawn, who advised the Churchwardens to write to the Borough Council explaining the situation & asking for their decision on the subject. Mr. Sawn read Council's opinion as to the liability of the Borough Council to keep the Church yard in decent order & the matter was left in the hands of the Churchwardens with power to act.

The Churchwardens agreed to communicate with the Borough Council.

The question was raised as to whether the late gardener, George Jubb, could claim his full Old Age Pension while receiving the amount at present allowed him by the Trustees. The matter was to be left to the Churchwardens.

Moved by Mr. Blynn, seconded by Mr. Griffiths that the thanks of the Trustees be conveyed to Mrs. Manson for her gift to the Church of a Picture of the "Holy Family".

It was reported that the War Memorial Cross was to be fixed in the Church Yard wall in Church Row.

It was originally intended that the steps of the Memorial should extend on to the footpath, but difficulties had arisen with the Borough Council &

Mr. Slyn reported that cutting the Christian names instead of the initials of the Fallen on the War Memorial, would cost £ 30 extra.

The amount required for the Memorial not having been fully subscribed,

At a Meeting held in the Church Vestry
Tuesday July 12th 1921

The Trustees hesitated to incur this additional expense, Mr Leslie Moore had however kindly offered to defray the cost as his contribution to the Memorial Fund, an offer which the Trustees gratefully accepted.

Mr Moreland asked for help to meet the expenses of the Men's Club & Institute. The members were willing to double their subscriptions. Mr Coates expressed his opinion that in time the Club would be self supporting.

Mr Moreland raised the question as to how the Trustees & the Parochial Church Council were going to act together & he suggested that if the two bodies agreed, the Parochial Church Council at their Easter Meeting, should elect the Trustees on the Ruridecanal Conference & also on the Parochial Church Council.

By this means all the Council would be Trustees & all the Trustee Councillors. Mr Moreland added the following information - The Trustees are elected under an Act dated 14th June 1827, & consist of Sir Maryon Wilson, Bart; the Vicar, the Senior Curate, the two Churchwardens & twenty one other persons, making twenty six in all.

They are to be members of the Church of England, & rated in the Parish at £40 per year. The election is by the Vestry & the Parish.

The Parochial Church Council is to consist of communicant lay members & qualified electors.

The annual election is at the Parochial Church Meeting at Easter, by qualified electors. The duties are approximately the same.

Mr Morris suggested as a way out of the difficulty, that the Trustees & the Parochial Church Council might each appoint a sub-committee to consider their respective duties.

Moved by Mr Spence, seconded by Mr Moreland.

It is recommended that in future the Trustees & the Parochial Church Council meet at the same time & that this Resolution be brought before the Council for their consideration.

As an Amendment -

Moved by the Vicar, seconded by Mr Griffith.

That consideration of the difficulties of the working of the Act of 1827 & the measure of 1921 be postponed till the October Meeting of the Trustees & in the meantime endeavour be made to discover what other Parishes similarly situated are proposing to do.

Carried unanimously.

Mr Glyn reported that at a special Vestry Meeting held in the Choir Vestry the 13th ulto, the burial fees were increased 50%.

Mr. Slyn reported that the Parochial Funds were in an unsatisfactory state, there would probably be a deficit of £200 at the end of the year in Church expenses.

Mr. Moreland suggested as a measure of economy that the Parish Magazine, Report & Service Paper might be combined as in some Parishes - after further discussion it was

The question of an appeal to seatholders & others for increased financial help, be left to the Churchwardens.

Miss Silk estimated the receipts from the Magazine from now to the end of this year at £68 - & the expenditure at £79 a shortage of Day £11 to £12.

To carry on the Magazine as at present, about £15 to 20 a year would be required from the Church Funds.

The arrangement with the Printer & the Advertisers could be determined on the 31st December.

Mr Grace thought his collections could not be kept up in full without the Annual Report.

Recommended That the Annual Report be continued, the cost per annum is say £27 for printing & delivering.

That a 100 Sheet Church & Parish Paper be printed monthly in place of the Magazine & Service Papers & that subscriptions be asked for from seatholders & others to defray the cost, also that a box be placed in the Church so that others may obtain a copy at a charge of 2^d per month as with the Magazine now - Estimated cost of Papers is £4 a month.

The loss on the Magazine may be estimated at from £15 to 20 & the cost of the Service Papers at £32 a year.

It was hoped that the sale of the proposed Church & Parish Papers might realize £50 per annum. It was suggested that seat holders might be asked to subscribe a fixed sum yearly.

A trial to be made for one year"

Moved by Mr Stanley Brown seconded by Mr Coates
That these recommendations be

Accepted for one year.

Mr Calkin objected to the discontinuance of the Service Papers and Magazine in their present form & moved as an Amendment that the Parish Magazine & Service Papers be continued as heretofore - efforts being made to obtain additional subscribers.

The amendment being lost the original motion was put by the Chairman & seconded by Mr Glyn, seconded by Mr Coates & that a Special Meeting of Trustees be called early in December to meet the Parochial Church Council to consider the best means of co-operation between the two bodies.
