A letter was read from Mr. F. L. Bradley, resigning his position as a Church Trustee owing to his having left Hampstead, his resignation was accepted with regret.

A hearty vote of thanks was given to Lady Blomfield, Miss Slyn, & Miss Rooth for preparing a Card Index of those connected with the church.

Bishop Goldsmith read a letter from the Bishop of London with regard to Self Denial Week and asked those present to give the financial scheme put forward by the Church Wardens their most earnest consideration.

The financial Scheme which was put forward by the Church Wardens was as follows:-

During the last four years, owing to the increase in expenditure, which it was not thought advisable to reduce, it has been a great difficulty to balance the accounts without continual appeals for extra money, & it is felt that the time has come where it is necessary to make a change in the financial arrangements, which can be divided into three groups, viz:-

i. Church Funds,

Consisting of Clergy, Chair, Church Expenses in Salaries, Heating, Lighting, Repairs, Printing, Insurance, the maintenance of the Mission Hall and Institute and Men's Club, providing for the Parochial and Sunday Schools, Country Holidays, Clothing, Coals and Blankets, Guild, Mothers' Union, Girl Guides, Church Lads Brigade, and the Girls' Friendly.

ii. Diocesan Funds.

iii. Missionary Work.

It has been forcibly pointed out that the congregation receive back in the Church Services the whole of the Church Funds for themselves, which have been termed "dues" in

distinction to the other items, Diocesan and Missionary Work, which are given away and can be termed "Alms".

It is therefore suggested that an endeavour should be made to supply the Church Funds (i) from Voluntary Offerings, the whole of the Collections going to the Diocesan (ii) and Missionary objects (iii) including Easter and Whitsun offerings.

which is available for reducing the £ 2,240 to £ 2,000.

This arrangement has been unanimously approved by the Trustees & Parochial Church Council. Although this implies a complete revision of the accounts, & requires more money, it is felt that the congregation will back up the scheme, as it is evident that the

Church Funds must form a first charge on the Parish.

The Review will be continued, but will be free.

The scheme will be:-

- i. The Congregation may apportion their subscriptions to any particular Fund if they specially desire, but it will render the finance easier if they give to the General Church Fund.
- ii. Every member of a family is asked to contribute.
- iii. The enclosed should be returned to H. Grace, Esq. 43 Netherhall Gardens, M.W.3. (addressed envelope enclosed) or put in the Collecting Bag on Sunday January 14th or 21st, 1923, together with the January payment. Cheques to be made payable to H. Grace Esq.
- IV. Other payments can be sent to him, or put in the Collecting Bag when due, for which envelopes will be provided.

All Subscriptions may be anonymous or otherwise.

It was formally proposed by Mr Phipps and seconded by Mr Coates.

The collections this year are approximately the same as last, the difference being that the Hospital Collection fell short by about £20 and there has been a diminution in the Boxes of about £18.

It was Resolved to appoint a sub-committee to consider and report upon the pew rents payable to the Lord of the Manor and the owner of Montague Grove, the following were appointed upon the sub-committee in addition to the Vicar who was to serve as an ex-officio member:- The Churchwardens, the Secretary of the P.C.C. & Sir A. Haye Butterworth.

Miss Bartram made a report on the Life and Liberty movement which was as follows:-

General Approval was given by the National Assembly to a measure for the union of benefices, proposing

to set up in each Diocese a Committee of the Diocesan Conference which would survey the Diocese and its needs, and suggest amalgamation of Parishes to the Bishop.

A Scheme was suggested for the division of the Diocese of Winchester into three parts (two new dioceses of Portsmouth and the Wight, and Guildford). Other Schemes were for the division of the Dioceses of Manchester and Southwell, each into two. The three Scheme received general approval.

The Benefices Act Amendment was also approved. This was to stop the sale of Livings. It would become impossible for Livings to be sold after the next two Vacancies.

The Parochial Church Council's Additional Powers Measure was thrown out.

The Clergy Pensions Measure reached the stage of Revision. As the Measure now stands, every newly-ordained Clergyman must insure himself for a Pension of £25 at 65 years of age.

This his Diocese is to supplement by another £25 and that will secure him £75 from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, in all £125.

The House of Clergy & House of Laity gave general approval to the

measure for Prayer Book Revision.

It was Resolved that a copy of the Electoral Roll should be put up in the Church porch at a time to be decided upon by the Standing Committee of the Council.

Mr. Barrs raised the question of Sunday games in the Parks when, having regard to the fact that the matter was not upon the Agenda, a vote in accordance with No. 5 of the Rules of Procedure was taken as to whether the matter should be considered when

Miss Bartum as the representative of the Council on the Information Bureau of the Life and Liberty Movement reported as follows:-

"The Church Assembly met from July 9th to 13th. The Budget for the coming year was adopted, the Assembly authorising an expenditure of a sum not exceeding £151,234.

"The Union of Benefices Measure received final approval.

"The Delapidations Measure was passed - under its provisions a yearly payment will take the place of the large and less frequent demands of the present Act. Money will also be granted from the Revenues of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners towards the initial expenditure which will be necessary in order to bring the benefice houses throughout the

"Country into satisfactory repair.

"The Benefices Act Amendment "for stopping the sale of Livingo was revised and accepted.

"The Blackburn Bishopric Bill "received final approval, the new diocese of Blackburn being taken "out of the Diocese of Manchester.

"The Diocese of Southwell Division "Measure, providing for the foundation "of the Bishopric of Worksop was "passed through the revision stage.

"The Winchester Bishopric Measure "was finally approved and passed "after a long discussion.

"The Archbishop of Canterbury "warned the Assembly that the next "election to the House of Laity would be "on the basis of the registered electors "on the rolls of the Parishes and not "on the population and that unless "the numbers on the Electoral Roll "in many dioceses showed a large "increase on what they were at present, "the number of representatives from "these dioceses would be substantially "diminished in the next House of Laity.

"The Clergy Pensions Measure received "final approval.

"There was a lengthy discussion on "the Revision of the Prayer Book.

"No definite decisions were arrived at "and further discussion was postponed.

The Sub-Committee appointed to consider and report upon the Pew Rents held by the Lord of the Manor, and the Owner of Montague Grove, consisting of Bishop Goldsmith, Sir Alexander Haye Butterworth, Mr. Moreland Junr., and Mr. Morro, met on Tuesday October 9th 1923 at 9.30 p.m.

Mr. Morro produced Correspondence with the Solicitor to the Lessor and the Solicitor to the Owner of Montague Grove from which it appeared that the right to the pews was appurtenant to the freehold and had been held for a great number of years.

He also produced correspondence

with the Agent of the Lord of the Manor from which it appeared that the right to the pews had been vested in the Lord of the Manor for a considerable time.

It was Reported that in the past the Clerk to the Trustees had let these pews on behalf of the owner of Montague Grove and the Lord of the Manor respectively and had paid over the proceeds to those persons.

It was Resolved to recommend that this practice be discontinued.

On behalf of the Trustees and Parochial Church Council, we are glad to be able to report that the Scheme of Finance inaugurated in 1923 has been a success.

The whole of the up-keep of the Parish Church and its services, including Clergy, Choir, Salaries, Heating, Lighting, Cleaning, Repairs, Insurances, Printing for 1923, have been paid by the generous contributions of the members of the congregation, and not a single collection in church has had to be made for these purposes, except the Easter and Whitsun offerings.

In thanking the members of the congregation for this generous response, we would ask them to make a note in their diary of 1924 of the day on which they make their contributions.

We enclose a Bankers order which can be used by those to whom it would be a convenience. For those

who prefer to send cheques which should be made payable to Stanley de. Brown, Esq. we enclose a form.
