"That the Trustees & the Parochial Church Council meet together to consider all matters whether within the jurisdiction of the Trustees or the Council, but shall vote separately. If they do not agree the matters shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Council who shall decide whether the matter is within the jurisdiction of the Trustees or the Parochial Church Council and the decision of the body designated by the Standing Committee shall be final."

Vice-Chairman It was proposed by Mr. Griffiths & seconded by Mr. Yates that Mr. Moreland be re-elected as Vice-Chairman

Hon. Treasurer It was proposed by Mr. Griffiths & seconded by Mr. Monro that Mr. Saubey be re-elected as Hon. Treasurer

Hon. Sec^y It was proposed by Mr. Monro & seconded by Mr. Ashley that Mr. Mure be re-elected as Hon. Secretary.
All of which proposals were carried unanimously.

Resolution Re Accounts Mr. Monro pointed out the importance of having the Parish Church Accounts submitted to the Parochial Church Council before they are put before the Parochial

Church Meeting. After further discussion the following resolution was proposed by Mr. Monro & seconded by Mr. Moreland.

"That the Annual accounts be submitted to & approved by the Parochial Church Council before they are submitted to the Parochial Church Meeting" which was unanimously carried.

Dates of Meetings It was proposed by Mr. Moreland & seconded by Mr. Griffiths that the Parochial Church Council Meeting for the purpose of passing the accounts should be held on March 17th & the Parochial Church Meeting on March 24th which was unanimously carried.

Accounts The Hon. Treasurer made a statement of the accounts & after further discussion it was proposed by Mr. Griffiths & seconded by Mr. Randal Evans that the accounts be passed.

Entertainment Committee The question of the re-election of the Entertainment Committee was raised & after discussing the matter it was resolved.

That the Church Wardens be elected on to the Entertainment Committee & that Mr. & Mrs. Fowler, Mr. Goodwin, Mr. Syle & Mr. Barratt be re-elected, also that the Committee should have power to co-opt further members.

that the accounts be passed, which was unanimously carried. Mr. Townroe in proposing the passing of the accounts congratulated the Hon Treasurer on the satisfactory state of the accounts.

Verger.

Mr. Monro raised the question as to the cause of the drop in the pew rents, & said that he thought it should be considered whether this was due to the change made by having Eucharist Communion at 11 a.m. & Matins at 11.15 a.m., the result of which in his view was, that the 11.15 service was poorly attended & not of an inspiring nature, that so far as the Eucharist Communion service was concerned, the prayers were inaudible & a good deal of what took place was, when sung, unintelligible. He compared the matins as they were to-day, with the inspiring morning services held in the Church 20 years ago when the Church was full of people of all ages - Further, he said he understood the reason given for the change from the morning services held in the Parish Church for so many years was that it would attract young people to come & take part in the affairs of the Church but judging by the numbers of the C.C.C. he did not think this result had been obtained.

Some of the present said they hoped the 10 a.m. service would be continued, & that there was a falling off in Church attendance every where, that the fact that young persons were not on the Parochial Council could not be claimed as a true index of the state of affairs. Rather was it

true that they could not be got to take part in any of the activities of the Church.

After some discussion it was agreed on Mr. Munro's suggestion to proceed with the next business.
