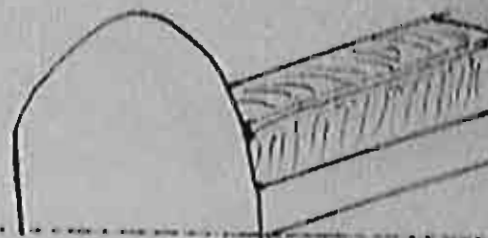

INSCRIPTIONS (refer to Millward, position on sketch, or FS)

The name "Marryat" can be seen on one of the pieces of the broken headstone lying nearby, but the inscription as a whole has gone. The footstone shows faint traces of initials and illegible dates.

Millward's version was as follows:- (page 812, tomb 526)

Sacred to the memory of / Mr. Thomas Marryat / of this  
 Parish / who died Nov 4th 1793 aged 57 /

Also / Mrs. Ann Marryat / wife of the above / (died July  
 14th 1825 aged 57 /)

Also / Hannah wife of the above / Mr. William Marryat /  
 died Dec 20 1827 in her 57 year /

Also / Mr. Thomas Eaton / formerly of this Parish / husband  
 of a beloved niece / of the above named Wm. Marryat / died  
 23 Nov 1851 aged 94 /

Footstone shows initials: TM / AM / WM / HM / TE /  
 and dates: 1802 / 1825 / 1827 / 1851 /

NB ++ Millward left out the MI to William MARRYAT at this point.  
 According to the footstone, Ann Marryat died in 1802, and William in 18
