

N. side: In loving memory of / Robert Swart Shaw / the second son of William and Elizabeth Shaw / who departed this life Nov. 21 1864 aged 41 years / Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called the children of God / Janet Shaw / daughter of William and Elizabeth Shaw / who departed this life Jan. 7 1892 aged 83 years / Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God /

W. side: In loving memory of / William Shaw / who died 7 / on February 19 / and was interred in 7 / West Church burying ground / Also of / Elizabeth Shaw / his wife who died on April 7 / 1883 in her 99th year / Return unto thy rest / O my soul for the Lord hath / dealt bountifully with thee

S. side: In loving memory of / Richard Norman Shaw R.A. / the youngest son of William and Elizabeth Shaw / who departed this life Nov. 17 1912 aged 61 years / Thou sayest come again ye children of men / Also of Agnes Howell Shaw his wife / who departed this life 3rd Feb. 1932 aged 85 years / The grass withereth the flower faileth but / the
