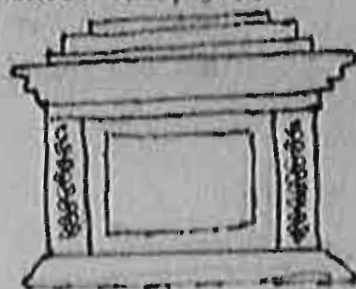

W. side: In loving memory of / William Shaw / who died ? / on February 19 ? / and was interred in ? / West Church burying ground / Also of / Elizabeth Shaw / his wife who died on April 7 / 1883 in her 99th year / Return unto thy rest / O my soul for the Lord hath / dealt bountifully with thee
