

Presumably the brewery Vincents, though they have unexpected connections with gentry and the law.

John Vincent Senior had a brewery in the High St. around 1700 and laid water pipes thither from the Cold Bath near Well Road; he also brought the first piped water to other Hampstead residents. He ran Jack Straw's C. stle c. 1713.

John Junior (presumably mentioned in the 'lot indiatinct' in the MI) rebuilt the brewery 1720 (see arch in the High St.)

Robert, son of John Junior, owned Nos. 3 - 17 High St (see plan o/o LHC), two pubs - White Hart and The Still, and the Well Road pond (see 1762 Survey).

Richard is called 'Esq' by Lysons and said to be the Middle Temple
