Also of Frances Anne widow of the above / and

slab: Also of / Thomas Henry Cooper / M.R.C.S. (ENG) /
eldest son of the said / Thomas Cooper /
who departed this life / 8 January 1881 aged
33 years

William Purton Esq was a close friend of Constable. He lived in
Squires Mount (1840 Directory) and loved landscape painting. Many
letters to him from John Constable in the 1830s have survived.

Charles Cooper lived in the converted Long Room in Weatherall Place
(1840 Directory and Park p. 251)

Thomas Cooper lived there in 1854 Directory and 1873 Directory
