this Place who departed this life the 5th day of
December 1748/aged 14 Months & 1 Day

Also the body of George Booth/(Son of the aforesaid
Nathaniel Booth Esq & Margaret his wife)/ who
departed this Life September the 3d 1757/aged
12 years

Rest undisturb'd ye much lamented pair/
The smiling infant & the rising Heir/
Ah! what avails it that the blossoms shoot/
In early Promise of maturer Fruitt/
If Death's chill Hand shall nip their Infant Bloom/
And wither all their Honours in the Tomb!/
Yet weep not if in Life's allotted Share/
Swift fled their Youth - they knew not Age's Care.
