March 5th, 1915, aged 82. (This along the bottom edge

Basil, wine merchant of New Bond St, was called "father of the
London wine trade" by Thompson.

He came to Hampstead in 1826 and lived some time in Pond St (e.g.
1840 Directory) before buying part of the Belnise Estate (1841)
and rebuilding Hillfield.

Charles & Robert were great benefactors of St Stephen's, Rosslyn Hill.

Mary Bianca was a "much-beloved Sunday School teacher" there.
