

Stephen Guyon, son of a Huguenot refugee, was born in Ireland in 1707, married Elizabeth Lacaux and moved to Hampstead c. 1790.

He is in 5 / 6 The Mount in the 1762 Manor Survey, but lived at Frogmal Hall from about 1766 until his death.

Was in the "Commission of the Peace for Middlesex" (1779 cutting, IHC)

His son, Henry William, left 21 children, including John, who fathered the most famous Guyon (see UNB) - Richard Debaufre, a general who fought in the 1848 Hungarian uprising and had a street named after him in Budapest.
