

Sacred to the memory of / John Key / of Denmark Hill  
Surry (sic) Esq / who died August 28th 1821 / aged 55 years

And of Mary Ann Key his wife / who died March 21 1821 /  
aged 45 years

They were exemplary and happy in their lives / and in  
their death they were not divided

West side To the memory of / William Cade Key Esq /  
who died October 14 1823 / aged 49 /  
leaving a wife and children to mourn his /  
irreparable loss

Also the remains of William Down Key Esq / only son of the  
above / William Cade Key Esq / who departed this life /  
at Kensington on the 31st of / August 1836 aged 23 years

Also Rose Tayer relict of the / above William Cade Key  
who died at / Brighton January 9 1843 in her 70 year

Jonathan senior owned Greenhill Estate and died at Mount Grove  
(1805-7 Directory)

Jonathan junior later lived at Stanfield House  
(Baines p. 549)

John of Denmark Hill was the father of Sir John Key, who lived  
in Church Row (s.g. 1840 Directory) and was the Lord Mayor of  
London 1830/31.

The latter had a son, Sir Kingsmill Key, not to be confused with  
the Kingsmill in this grave.

The family made their fortune as wholesale stationers.  
(MSB re Sir John)
