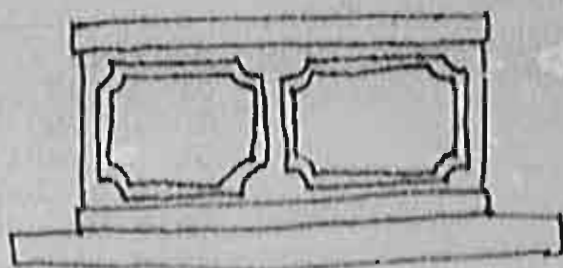

DESCRIPTIONS (refer to Millward, position on sketch, or FS)  
 (East facing)

Millward 440/58

Top In this tomb is deposited the body of Phillip Ibbetson Fenton Esq  
 son of Thomas Fenton and Elizabeth his wife / of  
 Munslet near Leeds in the county of York / formerly an  
 eminent merchant of Riga in the Empire of Russia and late  
 an inhabitant of this parish / in which he had resided the  
 last 13 years of his life / he was born 13 November 1734 OS (O.S.  
 style - see below) at / Houghton Tower in Lancashire, the seat of  
 his maternal uncle Sir Henry Fenton Bart / After a well spent  
 life he died at his house at Hamstead / the 15th August 1806  
 in the 72nd year of his age / deeply lamented by his  
 relations and friends

Here also reposeth the body of Margaret Fenton who died on the  
 21 November 1827 aged 79 years / She was the wife of James  
 Fenton Esq of this place, nephew of the above-named Phillip  
 Ibbetson Fenton Esq and the second daughter of the late  
 John Canning Esq of Fairfield near Glasgow

And the body of James Fenton Esq who departed this life on the  
 13 January 1834 in the 80 year of his age, the husband of the  
 said Margaret Fenton

Likewise the body of Miss Mary Fenton / youngest daughter of  
 James and Margaret Fenton who died aged 43 on the 3 July 1839

(Note: the style calendar began in 1752. eleven days were lost in  
 September and the new year no longer began on 26th March.)
