

East face Dorothy Anne Fenton third daughter of the above named James and Margaret Fenton died 27 May 1859 / aged 72 years

N. face, left side James Fenton Esq second son of the above named James and Margaret Fenton died 23 September 1861 aged 73 years

N. face, rt. side Henry Philip Fenton Esq / of HBM Diplomatic Service / son of Philip Ibbetson Fenton and of Sarah Rebecca his wife and / grandson of James and Margaret Fenton / died in the Hague 5th August 1907 / at an advanced age and was buried there / He was the last survivor of this branch of / the Fenton family in the male line

West face In memory of / Ellen / eldest daughter of / Philip Ibbetson Fenton Esquire / She died in Brussels / the 30th day of November 1893 (? 7) / aged 83 (?) years

S. face, Left side In memory of / Mary / youngest daughter of / Philip Ibbetson Fenton / wife of Jean Baptiste Victor de Mullendorf / of Luxemburg in the Grand Duchy of Luxemburg / she died in Bruges / on the 18th (?) day of April 1870 / aged 54 years

S. face, rt. side In memory of James Ibbetson Fenton / of Riga Province of Livonia (?) Russia Esquire / eldest son of Philip Ibbetson Fenton / of Clock House Hampstead / and of Sarah Rebecca his wife / he died in Riga and was buried there / on the (?) day of October (?) 1851 / aged (?) years

Tip I and his family came to Fenton House in 1793 - then called Clock House. Tip's nephew James I (d. 1874) inherited the house and altered the entrance etc. He convened the first health protection meeting in 1829 (see Guide to Fenton House). On his death, the family lost its link with Hampstead.
