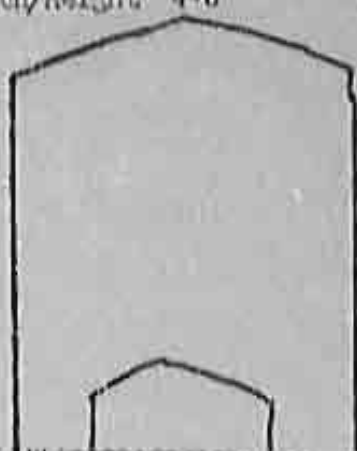

East side: Sacred / to the memory of / Walter Finch Silver / the fifth son of / Stephen & Frances Silver / who fell asleep in Jesus / Sept. 28th 1847 / in the 21st year of his age / Rom. viii.38.39.

Also Marianne Nine Silver / aged 26 years / sister of the above / She entered into the rest that remaineth to the people of God / Looking (off) unto Jesus / 27 November 1849 /

Also Septimus Silver / aged 21 years / youngest son / He fell asleep in Jesus / Sept. 3rd 1854 / As for me I will behold thy face / in righteousness / & (? I) shall be satisfied where I awake / with thy likeness.

West Side: In memory of / Stephen Winckworth Silver / Father of the before named / who entered into rest / Oct. 4 1853 / aged 65 years / Rev.xiv.13 / \*\* Also of / Frances Susann Silver / wife of the above named / Stephen Winckworth Silver / who died 19th Nov. 1869 / aged 78 years. 1.Tim.1.15.
