

Holford, Charles (c.1774-1838) one of two elected leaders of Hampstead volunteers, guardian & trustee of poor. Among first subscribers of Hampstead Public Library. Lived in house at top of hill near Squires Mount, later a girls reformatory (Baines p 281 452 542). A trustee of Hampstead Subscription rooms (Hampstead Subscription room Book of Tenancy) Left £100 to poor of parish (Vestry minutes 14.1.1839: 24.1.1839) leader of petition concerning Hampstead Heath in 1829 (Thompson, Hampstead P 14).

Holford, Mary Ann. Listed among nobility, gentry and clergy of Hampstead in Pigot's Directory of Middlesex 1840, where she is shown as living in Grove House.

Holford Rd. Was named after old Hampstead family of Holford (see Hampstead Public Library index).

Holler Edward, Listed among nobility, gentry and clergy of Hampstead in Pigot's Directory 1840, where he is shown as living in Hampstead Heath (Edward Toller union, lived in Church Row).
