

Monro was born about 1880 (he joined the local cricket club in 1896), became a solicitor and was for many years secretary of the Royal Sailors' Daughters Homes in Fitzjohns Avenue - now Monro House, named after him.

He wrote a History of the Hampstead Cricket Club (1949), in which it is stated that he was ' a Reptonian, an Oxonian and no mean cricketer'. He lived the last 40 years of his life at 4 Redington Road.
