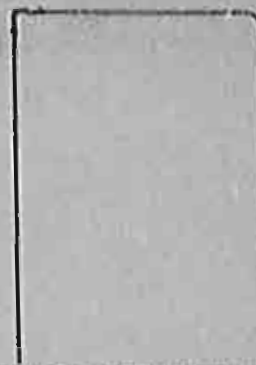

INSCRIPTIONS (refer to Millward, position on sketch, or FS)

Be it for ever remembered / to the only praise and glorie / of God who made
 ye said John Rixton an instrument to / give by his last will three pounds a
 yeare for the / good of the poore of this parish of Hampstead / for ever
 to be paid by the owners of the house / wherein Mr Netmaker now dwelleth +
 in Hampstead Streete and his will is y^t two pounds twelve shillings / thereof
 shal (sic) be paid at ye end of every yeare after / his decease for bread to be
 distributed by the / churchwardens of this parish for the time being / to ye
 poorest sort of people inhabiting within this / parish upon every Sabboath (sic)
 daie by twelve pennyworth / every Saboath yearly for ever & ye other (sic)
 eight shillings / (residue thereof) he giveth to him y^t shalbe clark of /
 this church for ye time being yearly to be paid him on / every Christmas day
 for ever provided that he (or / some other for him) do yearly keepe these two
 marble / stoness clean from wet & dust wth wiping them so oft / as neede
 is otherwise this eight shillings to be given / to some other y^t will and doth
 yearly perform ye same
