

Park p. 334: (His father) Mr Thomas Longman was a bookseller in Paternoster Row.
He died at Hampstead and was buried at Barnet, 1797.

Son of Thomas Longman (1730-97), who came to Hampstead c. 1792 and lived
at Manor House, Frog Lane.

He was there from c. 1800 (see H1) and moved to Mount Grove, Greenhill,
c. 1812. Here he entertained Scott, Southey, Coleridge, etc., grew
pinenapples and other hothouse fruit and died worth £200,000 - after
being thrown from his horse in St Pancras (some say Haverstock Hill).
The family vault is at Barnet.
