Here lies interred the body of  
 William Wyld late of London  
 Founder of Bells for Watches and  
 Musical Clocks who died 29  
 of May 1735 aged 73  
 Here also lies the body of  
 John Johnson successor to the  
 Said Mr Wyld who died 4 June 1745  
 aged 43  
 Both of them were eminent for their  
 ingenuity and esteemed for their  
 integrity.  
 This stone  
 belonging to the relations  
 Mr Thompson of Devonshire St  
 Queen Sq Bloomsbury  
 being out of repair  
 was at his expence  
 refixed in the year  
 1809
