Local History Collection: "Owners of Property & Proxies, 1837", p. 11. Charles Henry Pilgrim lived at York Terrace, Regents Park, but held a copyhold house, garden & premises in Roslyn Street, which was lived in by Mr. E. H. Nevinson. Presumably this is the son of the Pilgrims buried here.

These are the local landowners, who left their name on Filgrim's Lane.

James Was a Vestrymin' (e.g. in 1985) and had a 'house in the High

Street and land nearby' (Manor Minutes 1787). The 1805 Directory
puts him on Red Lion Hill.

Nevinson is shown at Filgrin's House in 1840 Directory, later called Rosslyn Hill House.
