

South side, left hand panel:

To the Memory of / Polly wife of Mr. Henry White / of this Parish /  
who died suddenly July 28 1823 / in the 58th year of her age /

Thomas White Son of the above / died March 4th 1827 / in the 27th year  
of his age /

South side, right hand panel:-

Henry White Esq / of this Parish / who departed this life / the 14th May /  
1844 / in the 78th Year of his age. /

Local History reference: Deeds 52, 159 and 160 relate to Henry White the younger, trustee of the will of H.W. Mortimer his brother-in-law. Deeds 20 and 130 may perhaps refer to the elder Henry White, but doubtful. D.G.L.F.

Henry, senior, is a bricklayer in the 1762 Survey.

In 1769 he built 13-15 Holly Mount (Hellings).

In c. 1775 he led the copyholders' opposition to the building of Heath Lodge and

in 1780 led the copyholders' successful claim to dig sand and gravel on the Heath (Farmer, etc.).

Henry, junior and his son (another Henry, who became a stockbroker and owned much of Holly Mount), were champions of the Heath and helped save it (Thompson).

The father lived at 6 The Mount and owned 16-24 Holly Hill.
