Park p. 315 : 'On a slab in the church-yard'

Subtus jacet Joannes STEEDMAN de Pillington in agro Staffordiensis oriundus. Officium Clerici examinantis sub Arthuro TREVOR Armig. Dno Curiae Cancellarii examinatorum, annos per septem pro virili fideliterq. exercuit; et per multos annos (optandum erat) exercuisset; sed morte immatura correptus, vitam posuit & labores aeterna frui requie: obiit, amicorum desiderium, officij decus, ix<sup>o</sup> die Decembri anno 1716, aetatis suae xxv.

(He was born July, in 1686 in Staffs, a son to Mr. John Steedman  
In 1703 he was admitted into the (Chancery) school &  
faithfully for 7 years under Sir Arthur Trevor, head of the assessors  
of the Court of Chancery; and would have held it for many years,  
as was to be wished; but removed by untimely death, he laid down his  
life and work to enjoy eternal rest; he died, regretted by his  
friends, an ornament to his office, 9 Dec. 1716, aged 35.)
